Yorkview's Active and Sustainable Transportation Plan Update

Last year, the City of Hamilton, Public Health, and Yorkview entered into a partnership to promote biking and walking as safe ways for students to come to school. To date, our School Council has obtained a grant to purchase another bike rack. The Hamilton Helmet Initiative was promoted throughout the school to provide families with affordable ways to purchase bike helmets for students. Our newsletter has featured articles on the need to get students out of cars and walking/biking to school. Our Environmental Stewardship Committee has conducted a walk around of the site and advocated for a mid-block crosswalk and crossing guard to be provided at the front of the school. We are waiting for the City to conduct a survey to determine need. The committee has also managed to secure an agreement with the City to get speed reminders posted on McKay and Cameron. On April 18th and June 20th, we are encouraging as many students as possible to wear yellow and walk/bike to work. All of this work is done to promote greater health outcomes for children.
