Once HWDSB has been notified of a heat event, information will be posted on our website and the following precautionary steps will be taken for students:

- ☐ Limit physical outdoor activities
- ☐ Ensure access to water
- ☐ Close drapes and blinds
- ☐ Move students through cooler areas of the school
- ☐ Monitor students for symptoms of heat stress

School Council News

Much has been achieved this year by our School Council. There are basically 4 areas in which the Council acted this year. The first related back to the the School Improvement Plan. Data from teachers indicated that math is an area of need in the school. As a result, a grant was submitted to engage parents in supporting their children in math for next year. We expect this to be funded. Data also showed a need to support efforts to improve student well-being and Language skills. Council purchased 3 exercise bikes for students, physical education equipment, and 10 iPads. It also subsidized \$10.00 per student towards a trip and established a student assistance fund to help those in need.

The second area supported the school's Active and Sustainable Transportation Plan. The aim of this plan is to reduce traffic congestion and pollution while promoting student health and safety. Council was able to purchase through a grant a bike rack that has been installed at the side of the school. The Council also registered the school for Bike to School Week and supported efforts by families to reduce car use.

The third area addressed by Council was the back playground. An Environmental Stewardship Committee was formed and a partnership was developed with Green Venture to remove some of the asphalt and replace it with an outdoor learning environment. Some grants have already been approved and plans are underway to begin the Depave near the end of September.

Last, Council undertook a review of its own structures and procedures, and a formal set of by laws was adopted to guide future councils.

Much of what council was able to achieve this year is due to the support and guidance of our new Principal. Mr. Degner has done a remarkable job during his first full year at Yorkview. This strong partnership between school administration and the parent community bodes well for our students and our school.

We are indebted to the work of our members and look forward to another productive year.
