Welcome Back to Adelaide Hoodless!

I hope everyone had a great summer vacation. We have had a terrific first week back. The cooler temperatures have meant more comfortable learning environments.

Construction over the summer has brought significant improvements to our physical plant. The kindergarten conversion is almost complete. The new kindergarten room (former library) and grade 1 room (former book room) re-

ceived new floors, lighting, and paint. A wall was built between the two spaces to create separate class-rooms. Work is continuing in the lower level to improve the music room and to convert room 5 into the library. Work in these spaces should be complete by the end of September. Work will then begin improving the science and art rooms. Other improvements are scheduled and will be announced as details are finalized.

Adelaide will also be receiving a significant upgrade to our playground thanks to a joint project between the City of Hamilton and the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board. The first part of the project will be our project with Green Venture. We received a grant to de-pave parts of our playground. Our depave event occurs Saturday, October 14th at 9:00 am. We need all the volunteers possible to help remove the asphalt. The asphalt will be cut by professionals, but volunteer muscles are required to remove the pieces. Volunteers will be WSIB trained. We also welcome any donations of food and drink to help us get through the day. More information will be following shortly. We have partnered with a Landscape Architect to ensure our plants are low pollen and native to this area.

We had a few last minute changes to our staff over the summer. Ms. Gould is the temporary DECE in 9D with Ms. J. Morine and Ms. Roczniak. Ms. Roczniak is partnering with Ms. Morine in 9D. Ms. Morine will be here days 1-3 and Ms. Rozniak days 3-5. Ms. Centanni is in 9A with Ms. Ritchie. Ms. Husslage and Ms. Ridos are teaching class 9E. The teams of Ms. Fennell and Ms. Beasley and Ms. Tweedle and Ms. Theroux remain intact. Ms. Orovan will be teaching 1A for the month of September until re-organization at the end of September. Ms. Matthews is the new grade 3 teacher in 3A. Mr. Knight-Messenger is the new junior French teacher and shares 5A with Ms. Wagner. Ms. McFarlane (formerly Ms. Gagne) is our new primary LRT. Finally, we welcome Mr. MacLeod as our new vice-principal. We are very fortunate to have both Mrs. Wilson and Mrs. Glenn full-time in our office.

Fidget spinners are not allowed at Adelaide this year without following a process that will include meetings with the classroom teacher, Learning Resource Teacher, and administration. We support all students being provided with accommodations to help them focus. As a team (parent, educators, child) we will determine a plan to support this.

Students in grade 5-8 who wish to go out for lunch second nutrition break, must have a written note each day they go out. We will not accept a blanket letter of permission. The note must identify the date, the student name, and the lunch destination. This helps us to locate students who may not return after nutrition break. Student safety is a priority. Please see more detailed information on page 2.

We look forward to working with all of you to help build this amazing school community.

CREATIVE PLAYGROUND

Our creative playground is open to children in grades FDK-5 during nutrition breaks. All students in the school have received safety training and are expected to follow the rules.

Staff supervise the playground during both nutrition breaks and reserve the right to ask children to leave the area if they are not playing safely. Students are not allowed on the creative before (8:35-8:50) and after school (3:10-3:25).

We also will close the creative during wet weather or when the temperature drops below freezing. We reserve the right to limit use to the playground if we feel conditions are unsafe.

Cold and flu season is upon us. Please review proper hand washing procedure with your child. If your child is very ill (fever, vomiting, diarrhea) please keep them home from school.

In compliance with HWDSB policy, all volunteers, including volunteers for trips and volunteer drivers, must have a current Vulnerable Sector Check to be permitted to volunteer. We recognize this can be difficult. We are including the link that provides you the information required as well as an option to complete the form electronically. You also require a letter from the school. Please contact your child's teacher if you wish to receive a letter. If the cost of VSC is problematic, please speak to your child's teacher. We never want finances to be a barrier to parent participation.

FOOD FOR KIDS

Adelaide Hoodless is in the second year of partnership with Food for Kids. Food for Kids provides many of our students with nutritious food to help them over the weekend and holidays.

Kindergarten parents are reminded to bring their children in through the kindergarten doors. Please do not accompany your children into the school. This makes the halls too crowded and makes it difficult for us to monitor who is in the building. We have over 125 FDK students at Adelaide. The halls are crowded and we need to ensure everyone is safe. Please work hard to be on time so you do not need to enter through the front doors. We need to maximize every minute of instructional time!

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NUTRITION BREAK PROCEDURES

All students are required to stay in their home classes during Nutrition Break #1 (10:30am-11:10). Students in grades 5-8 are permitted to go out for Nutrition Break #2 (12:5pm-1:30), however, the following restrictions apply:

- Students who go HOME for lunch may have a blanket permission form signed and on file with the classroom teacher.
- Students who want to go out to a store or area business MUST have a written, dated and signed note for each day they go out. The note must clearly identify the lunch destination (for example Subway, KFC, the Fry Truck). We will not take phone call permission. This is for student safety in the event they do not return back to school or if the school is evacuated during nutrition break. We need to know where our kids are to ensure their safety.
- Students who leave for nutrition break must leave for the entire 40 minutes. Students must re-enter through the front door. Students will not be allowed back onto the school playground with food or beverages.
- All food and beverage must be consumed prior to re-entering the school.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Supervision on the playground begins at 8:35 a.m. There is no supervision prior to that time so we ask that students not arrive prior to 8:35. Please make sure that your child knows their correct entry door at the back of the school. JK-3 students will be met at their entry doors by a staff member. Grades 4 to 8 students will enter the school through the main doors at the back of the school. Students are dismissed out the same doors. Parents picking up students are asked to meet them at the back of the school at dismissal time. Please note that outside supervision ends at 3:25 and we expect students to be off the playground by that time. Please do not idle your cars along Springer or park in front of the school on Maplewood. Parents are reminded that parking in either parking lot is restricted to HWDSB staff and should not be used for drop off or pick up. Additionally, do not cut through either parking lot to access the school. Please enter the playground by the main gates only. We encourage your children to walk or ride to school.

Academic Celebrations and Character Recognition

At Adelaide we value the importance of both academic achievement and the development of character. Each term we recognize the academic achievement of our senior students at our Breakfast of Champions celebration. Character Education is a regular part of our daily life at Adelaide and each month the school focuses on a specific character trait. Students who consistently make Adelaide a better place to work and learn will be recognized through daily Hawk Eye awards, weekly draws and "Student of the Month" assemblies. we will continue to align our Learning Skills with our Character Traits and recognize students who demonstrate both the Character Trait and the focused Learning Skill(s) for the month. The Character Trait for the month of September is Respect. The HWDSB defines respect as "We treat others and ourselves with courtesy, dignity and positive regard. We honour the rights of others and ourselves. We respect belongings, the environment and the world around us". Please review ways in which your student can demonstrate respect at home and school and in the community.

Report Card Reminders

In keeping with the Ministry of Education's new *Growing Success* document, the format and timelines for report cards changed for school boards across Ontario 2 years ago. Standardized progress reports are distributed in November with two formal report cards coming in February and June. November progress reports will focus on learning skills and academic progress in the various subject areas but no formal letter or percentage grades will be given. Assessment and Evaluation Policy

The Ministry of Education introduced **Growing Success**, a provincial assessment and evaluation policy in 2010, based on longstanding guidelines developed to inform our Assessment and Evaluation practices. The Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board will begin implementing a board-wide assessment and evaluation policy based on this provincial policy in September 2011. Details of the HWDSB Assessment, Evaluation and Reporting Policy will be available for students and parents on the board website in the fall of 2011.

Like prior school policies in HWDSB this policy includes specific responsibilities for students.

Use of Technology/PED policy

There will be many opportunities for students to access computer technology for school activities and assignments during the school year. We expect all students to respect the property and rights of others by following the Internet Use Agreement guidelines as well as the HWDSB and school Codes of Conduct when using the computer lab and classroom computers.

To limit distractions during instructional time all Personal Electronic Devices (PEDs) including cell phones, smart phones and personal music players (mp3, ipods, headphones etc.) are to be turned off in the classroom and stored in lockers (see below for Grade 7 and Grade 8 expectations). *Please do not attempt to contact your child via their cell phone during the school day.* An office phone is available for student and parent use when emergency situations arise. Please refer to your student's agenda for further details. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

New to Adelaide Middle School-TipOff

There will be an opportunity for our Grade 7 and 8 students to report cases of potential bullying (including inappropriate use of cell phones) via their smart phones through the use of an app called TipOff. This is an HWDSB initiative started last year at selected high schools and one middle school and is expanding to 30-40 schools in the district. Staff, students and parents will be provided with training in the near future. In the meantime, please see the information sheet included with this newsletter. Grade 7 and 8 teachers will be working through expectations regarding the appropriate use of cell phones both inside and outside of the classroom.

School Reorganization

Every fall the Hamilton -Wentworth District School Board goes through a reorganization process that is based on student enrolment. In this process, schools can be directed by the Board to open or close a class or classes depending on its number of registered students. Families will be notified by the end of September if their students will affected by the Board's reorganization process.

Tobacco Free School

This is a reminder to parents that it is illegal to smoke on school property. This includes property at the front of the school facing Maplewood, the sidewalks adjacent to the school on Springer and our parking lot. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Skateboard and Rollerblade Safety

Skateboards and rollerblades are **not allowed** at school due to the safety concerns they present on the playground and surrounding property. Boards and/or blades will be taken and stored at the office for the day as a one time reminder. Parents will be notified to retrieve these items after each repeated incident.

Nutrition Policy

The HWDSB's Nutrition Policy that outlines what can and cannot be served and/or sold in schools throughout the District. Each school is allowed up to 10 "special days" when food can be served that does not comply with the policy. These 10 days are determined by staff and parent members of our Nutrition Committee at the beginning of the school year. In keeping with the policy, we ask that baked goods **not** be brought to the school to serve to students to celebrate birthdays. Instead a book donation to your child's classroom library would be most appreciated.
