Next year we are projected to increase in student population. Currently, we have 596 students. Next year, we are projected to have 617 students. Due to this projected increase, we will have 26 classes, which is an additional two classes. We will be adding an additional Kindergarten class, as well as an additional Junior class.

Due to the increase in our student population and the limited learning spaces to accommodate this growth, the system program, Character Networks, will be re-locating to another school site for September 2019. We have welcomed this program as an important part of our school community for the last number of years, and we will be sad to say farewell to the staff and students who are a wonderful part of our Greenleaf family. With this increase in classes, we have begun hiring new staff members to our team for September.

HWDSB HEAT EVENT

With the warmer weather now approaching, Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board (HWDSB) would like to make you aware of our procedures during a heat event.

The City of Hamilton Public Health depart-

ment monitors weather forecasts closely and notifies the media and community partners of a heat event. A heat event occurs when the forecast calls for one or more days with a 40 degrees or higher humidex reading.

Once HWDSB has been notified of a heat event, information will be posted on our website and the following precautionary steps will be taken for students:

-limit physical outdoor activities
-ensure access to water
-close drapes and blinds
-move students through cooler areas of the school
-monitor students for symptoms of heat stress

DRESS CODE

Now that the weather is warmer, please support your child in choosing appropriate clothing to stay cool. Below is the dress code expectations.



HWDS

Students, staff and other school person-

nel are required to wear clothing that is appropriate and suitable for the school environment and setting.

The following are the expectations regarding dress code at A.A. Greenleaf School:

Students, staff and other school personnel will not wear:

- Clothing or jewelry that bears suggestive or objectionable pictures, logos, words, symbols, any offensive, violent or racist comments or messages
- Haltertops, tube tops, muscle shirts, tops with low cut necklines, spaghetti straps or tops that expose midriff sections or under-garments; shirt straps will be a minimum width of 2 fingers
- Pants, shorts or skirts which expose undergarments, or that are worn low on the hips. Shorts and skirts must be at least as long as the end of a student's fingers when their arm is fully extended at their side
- Jewelry that could compromise the safety of others

CLASS ASSIGNMNENTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2019



Round two of teacher postings and interviews are taking place over the next couple of weeks. Between now and September, please keep in mind that staffing may change due to a number of factors.

Having said that, tentative teacher assignments will be indicated when reports go home on Wednesday June 26th.

Our hope is that by doing this, first day of school anxiety may be reduced as children will have an opportunity to prepare over the summer. Our staff spends a tremendous amount of time and energy creating class lists. Staff teams collaborate to create these lists. Requests to have students move classes will not be granted.

Kindergarten students will receive a postcard in the mail indicating their class assignment and the date and time of the JK or new SK meeting on September 3. With the staggered entry, new JK students will have one hour visits on Tuesday, September 3rd. All Junior and Senior Kindergarten students start on Wednesday September 4, 2018.

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

With **SafeArrival**, families report a child's absence in one of the three ways:



- Use the SafeArrival website, go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or Goggle Play Store (or from links at go.schoolmessenger.ca). the first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 844-506-4350 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, seven days a week. You can report a future absence any time. Student records will show an unexplained absence if it is not reported. Late students must report to the office before going to class to have their attendance recorded.

COURTESY BUS TRANSPORTATION

All students who are eligible for Transportation to and from



school will be notified in writing by the bus company during the summer. If your child does not receive information about drop off and pick-up, they are not permitted to ride the bus. The School Board aims to have the buses that they

run full to capacity with eligible students. Each year there are some extra seats available on our buses. The number of seats varies each year and cannot be predicted prior to September. Parents can come into the office in September to get a form to request Courtesy Transportation. If and when we determine that we have extra seats available for Courtesy Transportation we will allocate the seats to the students who live the furthest from the school. Please know that Courtesy Transportation is not guaranteed from one year to the next. Each year we process the requests based on the number of seats available in that year. Also note: if your child is in Kindergarten this year and qualified for transportation but is in grade 1 in September, they may no longer qualify for transportation. The distance from school to qualify for transportation changes at grade 1 and again in the later years. The distance from school to qualify for transportation increases as the age of your child increases. To view the HWDSB Transportation Policy please refer to the Board website.
