Guest Speakers Hazel Cho and Marco Loberto, Children's Garden at Gage Park:

- Hazel Cho, Co-founder and former AMC parent and Marco Loberto, Community Engagement Coordinator.
- Marco and Hazel are part of a new program: reaching out to local schools to
 derstand how schools and parents would like to engage with The Children's
 Garden
 in the future.
- TCG began as a pandemic project when kids wanted their own gardens. Lots of support from community, councillors, city and TCG received a peacemaker grant. Everything in the garden is all taken are of children and their families. The growth was unanticipated, 2024 saw 2500 families participating. Programming was created in response to parent feedback. The children provide the most feedback and programming is in response to them.
- TCG works with Butterfly Way and other community partners providing education around gardens.
- Some events include the Fall Festival which is about harvesting, healthy eating, food, succession planting. The Garden Bedtime Bash is for planting bulbs and closing the garden. There is an attempt to cover the whole garden season.

- Thursday evening sessions to water/maintain/learn about the current state of the garden.
- Outreach from schools to do programming that schools and children are interested in and gets kids into the garden during school hours.
- 2023: offered a composting workshop Grade 3 classes came to a workshop for three Mondays and learned about soil, home composting, regenerating the Earth. This workshop has been expanded to other schools as well.
- Let's Get Growing workshop early April to learn different elements of early planting: propagation, mushrooms, edible flowers. Then families sign up and start the garden.
 May 17 into the garden.
- Summer camp opportunities and programming.
- · Child led, with volunteer educators.
- Seed library, story and toy share starting this spring.
- Rain barrel to teach about rainwater cycle and watering the plants.
- All programming is free, volunteer run organization supported by grants.
- What do schools want to do with field trips? What are we looking for?
- Applying for a grant to begin a booking program for 2025/26 school year.
- · Karley will send an email to teachers for more feedback
- Two hour block v full day event that includes the greenhouse?
- Caitlyn offered to share information about the program on social media.
- Want to attract families that aren't aware the garden exists.
- Caitlyn, Michael and Karley to continue the conversation offline.
- Willing to do programming in the schools in addition to within the garden
- Fundraiser 3 tickets to see and meet Shania Twain.

Treasurer's Report:
