This newsletter contains information that will be helpful to you as you start the new school year. Please keep this letter available so that you will have the information when it is needed. As well, we have enclosed a copy of your semester 1 timetable for the 2018-2019 school year. In order to prepare for a smooth beginning on **September 4th**, we are asking all students please pay the mandatory **\$20.00 student fee** through our **cash on-line system**. Please visit our website for more information on how to register for cash on-line. All you will need is the student number found on the report card or timetable. Once registered, you will be able to pay most fees through this system...field trips, yearbook etc. The student fee is used for entire school events like guest speakers, spirit days and other school events.

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Students will have the option to make changes to their timetable during the first ten days of school only. Students must complete a "Change Request Form" in the Guidance Office in order to see their Guidance Counsellor. Counsellors will be processing the Change Request Forms with priority given to students in their graduating year, then Grade 11 students, then junior students. All students must continue to follow their original timetable and attend all classes even after completing the Change Request Form. Students not present in class when they are called for will be placed at the bottom of the queue. Students should never assume that they will be dropping a class and stop attending while they wait to see their Counsellor.

Lockers will be assigned by the Homeroom Teacher on the first day of classes. Students returning to Ancaster will be able to re-use the locks they removed from their lockers in June. Students new to Ancaster must bring their own locks. The recommended locks are Dudley Combination Locks. **No key locks will be allowed.** Please do not share a locker with other students as we have enough lockers for every student.

On **Wednesday, August 29th** from 10:00 a.m. to approximately 11:30 a.m., we will be hosting an orientation tour for **all new grade 9 students**. Please meet in the **West Wing Auditorium** at 10:00 a.m. Student Council representatives will assist with the tours. If you are unable to attend, we ask that on **Tuesday, September 4th**, you report to the auditorium prior to 8:25 a.m. for our opening grade 9 assembly. All other students will report to their period 1 homeroom class as we will be following a day 1 schedule on Tuesday, September 4th. Our first school council meeting will take place on Monday, September 17th at 6:30 p.m.

The **Ancaster Parent Handbook**, created by our School Council, contains information to support parents and help their children be successful. An updated copy of this handbook can be found on our school website at www.hwdsb.on.ca/ancasterhigh. Be sure to check out our website throughout the school year for updates and information.

I hope this year will be successful and exciting for you. Ancaster has a great deal of success in many areas and you can become part of a great legacy. There is always someone available to help you or to answer questions and offer support. I want to welcome **Ms. Ferney**, who has joined our staff as our new vice principal. I know she will find Ancaster a great place to come to work every day. **Ms. Baillie** has moved to Glendale as their new vice principal.

On behalf of **Ms. Ferney and Mr. Currie, our two vice-principals**, I again urge you to become involved in as many school activities as possible this year. We are counting on your talents and energy to maintain Ancaster's reputation as a leading school in our area. Your commitment and contributions are essential in creating and sustaining a positive learning environment.

INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS OPENING DAY - TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2018

Opening day for the 2018-2019 school year is Tuesday, September 4. **Grade 9 students will report to the Auditorium in the West Wing prior to 8:25 a.m. for our opening day assembly.** Following the assembly, you will meet your homeroom teacher who will escort you to your homeroom (period 1) classroom. All other students are to report to their homeroom (period 1) class. **Please bring your timetable with you.** The following is the **time schedule for September 4.** Regular day time schedules are posted in all classrooms.

In your homeroom, you will complete registration forms and will be assigned a locker. Please bring a Dudley combination lock. Every student must use their assigned locker. In each class, you will receive an outline of the course and be issued the required textbook(s). Please look after your textbooks. You are responsible and accountable for all materials issued to you. You are required to return textbooks at the end of the semester, and you will be charged a replacement fee for lost or damaged textbooks. Textbooks are issued at no cost for all grades.

The last class ends at 2:45 p.m. and buses will arrive shortly thereafter. If there are bus issues, please contact the **Transportation Department at 905-523-2318.**

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5 WILL FOLLOW A DAY 1 SCHEDULE

All odd-numbered days are Day 1; even-numbered days are Day 2. Our school "Day Schedule" will correspond to calendar dates i.e. September 9, 11, 15 = Day 1 September 10, 14, 16 = Day 2

CAFETERIA SERVICES

Lunches are to be eaten in either of the two cafeterias. If you wish to purchase food, the cafeteria provides drinks, snacks and complete lunches. Eating in hallways or stairwells is not permitted due to Fire Code regulations.

STUDENT PARKING

Students wishing to park at school must register in the Main Office. Please adhere to speed limit signs and regulations or this privilege will be revoked.

EXAM AND REPORTING DATES

Please note the following dates. The dates for exams are particularly significant. It is not the policy of the school to reschedule exams due to holiday trips or work commitments. Final examinations and culminating activities are compulsory. **Examinations will not be re-scheduled or waived to accommodate students who wish to start work early or go on vacations.** Students and parents who require exams to be re-scheduled because of emergencies or other critical situations may request consideration in writing **to the Vice-Principal. Teachers are not authorized to re-schedule examinations.**

Parents must notify the school promptly if students will be **absent from an examination or culminating activity** because of illness or serious emergency. A doctor's note will be required for an illness. If students are late for an exam they should report to the office. Normally NO EXTRA TIME is allowed. If students **forget to show up** for an exam, they will not normally be allowed to write it.
