Randy Gallant Principal's report

- 1. HOSA 6 students in June will represent our school in Orlando- Ms Crowe is the teacher advisor
- 2. **Athletic banquet June 6th in the auditorium –** celebrate student athletes there is a lunch
- 3. **Hall of Distinction June 5**th **–** Fresh Local Kitchen will be catering the event Trustees, media will be here
- 4. Exams start June 20th but Grade 12s will start June 14th to get prepared for Grad schedule is coming out at the end of this week
- 5. **Community Prayer Breakfast –** at Liuna Station a non-denominational event in which different faiths attended
- 6. Grad ceremony June 27th at 4 at Carmen's
- 7. Service dog will be in the Social Communications Program for next school year while the service dog has the vest on it is working so it cannot be approached, pet, etc. More communication will be coming soon

Vice Principal Report

- Accessibility Project have to replace the lifts as they do not comply with standards – gone out to tender – this summer the spaces will be demolished to prepare for the new elevators for October 2019
- Windows will be replaced
- Work on the field has been delayed
- Cameras are up and working now have access continuing to fine tune the process

Rosemarie raised the question about staffing for next year: Randy responded with:

- 99 Teachers were declared redundant in HWDSB secondary teachers some teachers have already come off the list due to retirement letters coming in
- 7 redundant teachers at Ancaster High, however, 2 have already been recalled so there are currently 5 redundant teachers at Ancaster
- Any information that comes to Randy he has told the staff that he will share with them
- If we have the same # of students next year as we did last year, then we will have less teachers this means looking at the #s and looking at what courses the students have selected in order to build a timetable looking for creative ways to continue to offer programming/courses for the students
- No surplus teachers at Ancaster (if you have too many teachers for the # of students)
- When possibly cancelling courses, Randy doesn't just look at numbers he looks at whether the courses are compulsory or a "pathway" course, etc.
- Question about the selling of the fields in the back raised by Sandra The Trustees put forth a proposal and it was not received well by Ancaster residents and Lloyd Ferguson at this point Randy does not have any information
