Community Involvement & Literacy Test

In order to graduate, students require:

- 40 hours of community involvement
- a passing score on the Literacy Test

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Community Involvement Hours

- These are due on May 1, 2020
- Prom tickets are only sold to students who are track to graduate
 - This is measured by the completion of 40 community involvement hours
- You have known since July 1, 2016!

Full Disclosure - May 5 at 3:00 p.m.

- Applies to Grade 11 and 12 courses only
- Starting **five days after mid-semester report cards**, all courses in which a student is registered will be recorded on the transcript
- Courses that are dropped, failed, or repeated after this date will appear on your transcript
- Check post-secondary schools' policies

College/University Applications

- Continue to monitor your applications for offers of admission
- Check OCAS and OUAC to ensure:
 - Last semester's courses are uploaded with the correct mark
 - All of the current semester's courses are uploaded
 - All required courses for admission are there
- OUAC - make sure it reads "You will achieve OSSD"

Pathway - University

Make sure you are meeting all deadlines:

- Supplementary applications
 - Additional Information Form (Waterloo)?
 - Student Profile Form (Guelph)?
 - Personal Statement of Experience (Queen's)?
- Portfolios
- Competency/Aptitude tests
 - HOAE - Health Occupation Aptitude Exam?
- Interviews
- Accepting offers
- Residence applications

Pathway - University

- All offers of admission are conditional
- Admission averages will be recalculated in July, 2020 after final grades are received
- Universities will rescind offers of admission if conditions are not met
- Scholarships might be based on final admission averages

Offers of Admission

- Some offers are already out
- Round 2 offers continue until the end of March
- Universities just received Semester One grades!
- Regular offers begin in May once mid-semester grades are received
- All universities must respond by May 27, 2020
- Students must respond to offers by June 1, 2020

Pathway - College

- Offers of admission began on February 1
- Offers will continue on a “rolling basis”
- Students not accepted into a program will be placed on a waitlist – this will be updated after mid-semester grades are received

Residence (College & University)

- Universities will have deadlines for applications for residence
- Colleges may request that students apply for residence early as spaces fill up quickly

Financial Aid

- Begin O.S.A.P. applications now using the OSAP estimator
 - osap.gov.on.ca/AidEstimator1920Web/enterapp/enter.xhtml
- In order to complete your OSAP application, you must accept an offer of admission

Completing the Option Sheet for Grade 12's

Not returning in September?

- Circle NOT RETURNING (on the back)
- Circle the pathway being followed (Apprenticeship, College, University, Workplace)
- Sign/have a guardian sign (on the back)
- Return your option sheet to Mrs. Desrcochers in the Guidance office
- Log into Career Cruising and choose the “course” titled “Not Returning”

Year Five

- Most students are invited to return
 - Your vice-principal decides
- Students are invited for one additional semester only
- We ask students to select a minimum of three courses
 - If you wish to attend for two courses only, see your Guidance counsellor in June
 - The two classes must be offered back-to-back in the morning or afternoon
 - One class in the morning and one in the afternoon is not permitted.
Hopefully the two you want suit this model!
- Students wishing to return for Semester Two will apply in January
- You must have a plan!

Information on Courses for Year 5

- Talk to your current teachers about other courses they teach
- Talk to your guidance counsellor about courses that you should take in Year 5
- Use Career Cruising or the Secondary Course Calendar for detailed course information

e-Learning

- Many courses are offered online (check Career Cruising)
- Some courses are offered “online only” and are designated by an “@” symbol on the option sheet
- e-Learning classes are NOT easier and are NOT self-paced
 - The curriculum follows the same pace as regular classes
 - There are due dates throughout the course
 - Units will end and the curriculum will be locked
 - There will be a culminating activity and/or exam

Year Five - Option Sheet/Career Cruising

- Sign/have a parent sign the long white paper option sheet
- Bring your option sheet back to Mrs. Desrochers in the Guidance office
- Log into Career Cruising: select a maximum of four courses/credits
- Select Not Returning Semester Two

Using Career Cruising to Choose Courses

- Follow the instruction sheet!
- Log in to Career Cruising through “The Hub”
- If you are new to H.W.D.S.B. then you will need to use your Career Cruising USERNAME and PASSWORD
 - Contact your Guidance Counsellor for this information

Due Date - March 2, 2020

- Signed Option Sheet (long, white paper)
- Your courses should be entered into Career Cruising by this date
- School fees paid on School Cash Online (only if you are returning)

Summer School

- Students must make an appointment with their Guidance Counsellor in May
- Summer school courses last all of July and many have an exam
- Courses are offered in-class and online

Valedictorian - Nominations Due April 23

- Must have three unique teacher references
 - Academic, extra-curricular, character
- Must have been named to the Honour Roll last year, and must have a Semester One academic average of 80%
- Must have demonstrated good character, have not been in violation of our Student Code of Conduct
- No campaigning allowed (this includes Social Media)
- Short listing may occur for the speeches component
- Students choose their valedictorian based only on their speech (May 8)

Prom

- Thursday, May 28 at Liuna Station
- Tickets go on sale starting May 1 but will only be sold to students with at least 40 hours of community involvement on record

Graduation

- Graduation Ceremony is June 25 at Carmen's
- Graduates must arrive at 3 p.m.
- Each student gets two tickets, see Ms. DesRochers to join the waitlist for additional tickets
- Grad Gowns must be ordered by May 15 here:

Graduation Awards

- Students are only eligible to win a graduation award if they complete the Awards Information Sheet
- This is due to Mrs. Desrochers on April 3
- We use this information to identify student achievements and recognize them at graduation
