- If selected as one of four school-sponsored applicants, Western requires an online application (this can be used as a template to copy and paste your answers into the official application)
- We are not collecting transcripts, list of courses, or the names of your assessor for the purpose of determining the school-sponsored applicants (you *will* need these things for Western if selected)

NOTES

Every student is allowed to seek input from any staff member at the school, including their Guidance counsellor. We do not consider it an unfair advantage if some students seek this input over those who do not.

The four successful candidates for school sponsorship for the Western National will be chosen by the Ancaster High School Scholarship Committee, which includes the principal.

We ask that only students with **serious interest** in attending Western University (regardless of winning the school nomination for this scholarship) apply for this award.

We are not asking for any reference letters or contact information to determine the Western National school-sponsored applicants. Please limit your answers to the space provided below, but any size of font is okay. Don't feel that you need to fill all the space provided. Please note that if you receive the school's nomination, then you will be applying for the scholarship online, and there will be a character limit in place. Students might need to edit their answers accordingly.

B. ESSAY REQUIREMENT

Please include with this application an original essay written by you on an issue important to you of public concern. Explain causes, discuss why it is important and examine potential solutions. The length of your essay should be no less than 1,000 words and no greater than 1,250 words. Please indicate the word count on the last page (in brackets and bold font). Your essay should be typed and double spaced and it must be titled. The list of references must include a range of materials such as books, articles or other sources. *Please note that the essay you submit must be your own original work. Western University considers plagiarism to be a serious scholastic offense and any applicant found to have submitted a plagiarised essay will automatically be disqualified from the National Scholarship competition. In order to avoid committing plagiarism, you must be very careful to acknowledge all sources used in the preparation of your essay. You must reference all statements of fact, claims or direct quotes and document all sources in your list of references. Use the APA style.
