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



Ancaster High School offers six special programs that add to your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). All begin in Grade 11 and require little to no preparation in Grade 9 and 10. They are:

- International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (e-mail Mr. Taylor at dtaylor@hwdsb.on.ca). This requires FSF2D1 & MCR3U1 in Grade 10.
 Specialist High Skills Majors (SHSM) in Hospitality & Tourism. Information & Communication, Manufacturing, Health & Wellness, and Arts &
- SPECIAL PROGRAMS SYSTEM WITH

HWDSB offers seven system programs at other schools and require applications and sometimes interviews/auditions. All begin in Grade 11. Please select the course code in Xello to alert your quidance counsellor to your interest and then make an appointment:

- 1. "Work in Progress" Program (HWWIPP) offers paid co-op for students who need help graduating
- ArtSmart (HWARTSM) offers specialized courses in drama, voice, instrumental, dance, and musical theatre
 Building Careers from the Ground Up (HWBUILD) provides courses in residential/commercial construction
- Building Careers from the Ground Up (HWBULD) provides courses in residential/commercial construction
 Canadian Forces Co-op Program (HWCDNF) enrolls students in the Canadian Forces (militia) for one semester
- 5. Healthcare Support Services Program (HWHEAL) teaches students clinical/support skills in a simulated hospital ward setting
- Mohawk College Dual Credits (HWMCDC) offers students a half-day at Mohawk College in college courses that also count for high school

- Students should choose a level based on pathway plan and not achievement in Grade 9


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ENG2D1 versus ENG2P1

- The level of English you choose is the most important
- All degree programs in Ontario require a pathway that includes ENG2D1 (Academic English). Degrees are offered at colleges and universities
- All diploma programs in Ontario accept ENG2D1 (Academic English) or ENG2P1 (Applied English)
- Choose carefully

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Five Courses All Grade 9's Must Select

Xello will remind you to take these 5 courses in Grade 10:

1	Civics & Careers	CHV2O3 & GLC2O3
2	English	ENG2D1 or ENG2P1
3	History	CHC2D1 or CHC2P1
4	Math	MPM2D1 or MFM2P1
5	Science	SNC2D1 or SNC2P1

- If you have **failed** a Semester One class, please **re-take** this in Grade 10, even if you plan to attend summer school.
- Xello will not let you choose courses unless you re-take the one you failed from Semester One
- Once you register for summer school, we will replace the failed class with another course

Choosing Three Electives



- Usually need a Grade 9 or 10 Arts credit to take Grade 11 Arts
 (Visual Arts or Dramatic Arts) except
 - AVI301 (Gr 11 Visual Art Open Level) or
 - ADB3O1 (Gr 11 Musical Theatre Open Level)
- Must have a Grade 9 or 10 Music credit to take Grade 11 Music (Instrumental or Repertoire)

 Must have a Grade 10/Level 1 Language (French or Spanish) to take these in Grade 11/Level 2

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Things to Remember

- Finish Group 1, Group 2, and Group 3 credits in Grade 10 or 11
 - Group 1: Language, Social Science, Canadian & World History, Co-op
 - Group 2: Physical Education, Business, Arts, Co-op
 - Group 3: Science, Technology, Co-op
- Choosing Grade 11 courses in Grade 10
 - No need to "get ahead" by taking Grade 11 courses
 - Some students planning to take Calculus & Vectors in Grade 12 might choose to take two Math credits in Grade 10 (MPM2D1 and MCR3U1)

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
Notes on Choosing Electives

Choosing the correct level of Math in Grade 11 needs planning



Math & Post-Secondary



- MFM2P1 (Grade 10 Applied) is needed for MBF3C1 or MCF3M1
- MPM2D1 (Grade 10 Academic) is needed for MCR3U1

I.B. (International Baccalaureate Diploma Program)

- Starts in Grade 11 and students get two diplomas (OSSD and IB)
- Interested students should contact Mr. Taylor, the I.B. Coordinator (dtaylor@hwdsb.on.ca) with questions
- If interested, Grade 10 students should take:
 - FSF2D1 (Grade 10 Academic French)
 - MCR3U1E (Grade 11 Pre-I.B. Math)
- I.B. students don't have room for Art, Physics, Computer Science, or Tech Design and should take these courses in Grade 10 or summer school

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Special Information

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e-Learning

- Many courses are offered via e-Learning (check Xello)
- Some courses are offered "e-Learning only"
- e-Learning classes are NOT easier and are NOT self-paced
 - The curriculum follows the same pace as regular classes
 - There are due dates throughout the course
 - Units will and end and the curriculum will be locked
 - There will be a culminating activity and/or exam

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Summer School

- Students self-register for summer school and guidance counsellors double check and approve
 - Students must also notify us which course they'd like to take to replace the summer school course
- Courses lasts all of July and might have an exam
- Courses are usually offered in-class and via e-Learning
- There are very few electives mostly English, Math, and Science

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What's Your Best?

Grade 10 is the year to "do your best" in each course
