



Timetable Changes Open January 26

- Since August, counsellors have already made about 500 changes
- Many students requested multiple changes...and some asked us to reverse the change we already made!
- Students continue to book guidance appointments to ask for changes to semester two – please stop!
- Check your e-mail on January 26 if you want to submit a request
- Most semester two classes are full and all e-Learning is waitlisted




- Book an appointment with your counsellor for help planning your courses before March 6. Parents/guardians are invited too!

- Officially select your courses in MyBlueprint by March 6. Please show your choices to your parents/guardians.




Steps to Picking Courses for Next Year

- Check your e-mail on March 9 to see if any elective courses have been cancelled. Students affected will have an extended deadline (Friday, March 13).

Step 7

- Ask your parents/guardians to log into Parent Portal (web version only, not mobile) between March 30 and April 2 to verify your courses. Please e-mail your counsellor if there is a mistake or you changed your mind.





Note: Starting in September 2026, you must earn a new financial literacy graduation requirement as part of your compulsory Grade 10 mathematics course. You will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement and earn your high school diploma.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS – ANCASTER HIGH

Ancaster High School offers six special programs that add to your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). All begin in Grade 11 and require little to no preparation in Grade 9 and 10. They are:


- International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (e-mail Mr. Taylor at dtaylor@hwdsb.on.ca). This requires PSF2D1 & MCR3U1 in Grade 10.
- Specialist High Skills Majors (SHSM) in Hospitality & Tourism, Information & Communication, Manufacturing, Health & Wellness, and Arts & Culture. Please see back of page for a summary of required courses

SPECIAL PROGRAMS – SYSTEM WIDE

HWDSB offers seven system programs at other schools and require applications and sometimes interviews/auditions. All begin in Grade 11. Please select the course code in Xello to alert your guidance counsellor to your interest and then make an appointment:

1. “Work in Progress” Program (HWWIP) offers paid co-op for students who need help graduating.
2. Artsmart (HWARTSM) offers specialized courses in drama, voice, instrumental, dance, and musical theatre
3. Building Careers from the Ground Up (HWPBUILD) provides courses in residential/commercial construction
4. Canadian Forces Co-op Program (HWCDF) enrolls students in the Canadian Forces (militia) for one semester
5. Healthcare Support Services Program (HWHCAL) teaches students clinical/support skills in a simulated hospital ward setting
6. Mohawk College Dual Credits (HWMCCD) offers students a half-day at Mohawk College in college courses that also count for high school
7. Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program – Accelerated OYAP (HWOVAPA) offers students with co-op placements Level One training




NAC201 - First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Peoples in Canada


- The principal is offering students a chance to take NAC201 instead of CHC2D1/CHC2P1 – Canadian History Since World War 1
- If interested, choose NAC201 in myBlueprint and then e-mail your guidance counsellor who will replace History
- Students are invited to take *both* CHC2D1/2P1 *and* NAC201 and will receive one credit each
- Topics include: treaties, indigenous resistances, the fur trade, colonialism's impact on indigenous societies and more



Choosing Three Electives

- Usually need a Grade 9 or 10 **Arts** credit to take Grade 11 **Arts** (Visual Arts or Dramatic Arts) *except*
 - *AVI301 (Gr 11 Visual Art – Open Level) or*
 - *ADB301 (Gr 11 Musical Theatre – Open Level)*
- Must have a Grade 9 or 10 **Music** credit to take Grade 11 **Music** (Instrumental or Repertoire)
- Must have a Grade 10/Level 1 **Language** (French or Spanish) to take these in Grade 11/Level 2



Taking Grade 11 Courses in Grade 10


- Students are taking Grade 11 University Prep courses too early
- Students have more success in Grade 11 University courses after achieving Level 3 or 4 grades in Grade 10 Academic courses
- Students should **wait** and see how they do in Grade 10 Academic courses before selecting University courses



A Special Note on MCR3U1 - Functions


- We recommend that students consider multiple careers and multiple pathways
- This requires a lot of planning and thought
- Don't choose MCR3U1 "automatically" as the default math
- This course is designed for students pursuing degrees in Engineering, Accounting, Kinesiology, etc.
- This course demands excellent learning skills and includes a lot of higher-order thinking
- Please consider our advice in the next slides



MCF3M1 – Functions & Applications


- Expands on ideas from Grade 10 Academic & Applied Math
- Students recognize the concepts and are familiar with the type of thinking needed to be successful
- This course might be sufficient for our diploma-bound (college) and degree-bound (college or university) students
- *Example: Nurses: this could be all you need...maybe MDM4U1 too!*
- Consider taking MCF3M1 first and then MCR3U1





Math and Apprenticeship/Workplace

- Any level of Grade 10 Math is okay for an apprenticeship
- Grade 10 Applied (MFM2P1) is recommended
- Electricians need lots of math – MFM2P1, then MCF3M1, then MCT4C1
 - See your guidance counsellor for more information







Engineering and Math programs

If you are applying to a program in the Faculty of Engineering (including the Architectural Engineering program, but excluding the School of Architecture) or the Faculty of Mathematics, you should avoid taking courses required for admission outside of your regular day school or school board if possible. We want to see how you perform in each of the required courses during the school year where you will be balancing other courses and activities outside of the classroom as we assess your ability to be successful in our demanding full-time programs. If a required course is taken outside of your regular day school or school board, your admission average may be adjusted to reflect your previous performance in that subject.

For some programs, we may ask you to identify courses taken or being taken outside of your regular day school and to explain why the course(s) was not completed in your regular school.


I.B. (International Baccalaureate Diploma Program)

- Starts in Grade 11 and students get two diplomas (OSSD and IB)
- Interested students should have already applied – please contact Ms. Toor, the I.B. Coordinator (mtoor@hwdsb.on.ca) if not
- If interested, Grade 10 students must take:
 - FSF2D1 next year
 - MCR3U1 next year in semester two or in July 2027 (summer school)
- Note: I.B. students can't access courses like Art, Business, Physics, Computer Science, Tech Design, etc.



IB Certificates

- Starting in Grade 11, students can take partial IB, or IB certificates
- This means students don't need to take all five required IB courses and can choose one or more of:
 - IB Biology
 - IB Chemistry
 - IB Math
 - IB History
 - IB French
- There is no preparation required in Grade 10 other than MCR3U1 if you want a certificate in Math or FSF2D1 if you want a certificate in French
