Principal's Report

- Bomb threat this morning at Bellmoore, one of approx. 15 schools that received one today; school was cleared by the police by 8:55am; communication sent out by the board after school (some concerns expressed about how long it took to communicate but was a result of many people in the system to be contacted)
- Parking lot: only signage we are approved for are the current bylaw signs (ie. No additional "parking lot closed" signage allowed); digital sign updated to reflect parking lot closure; staff at the entrance to discourage parents from entering
- Anti-Bullying: met with a concerned parent and it was determined that her endeavors are more of a Safe Schools initiative at the board level; new program starting with 2 students per school joining a committee for 2SLGBTQI+ members
- Positive School Culture initiative: assembly to come in early February
- Bellmoore allotted approximately \$10K in rural schools funding. Funding spend TBD by Suzana

- Discussed a collaboration between council members and teachers on bazaar planning and execution. Decided this is ultimately a council-led event, but teachers can assist with building excitement and buzz around promotion and encouraging more families to attend; a callout can be put out if teachers want to volunteer with bazaar planning
