Equity Corner: Supporting Mental Grit

Times are not easy for our youth and the world of technology and social media adds a different dynamic to their daily lives that we as the adults did not quiet experience. The world of our youth is instantaneous: everything is fast and quick. While there are benefits to this, there does come a time when the skills of mental grit and stamina don't always align with this fast-paced world. These skills are important because they relate to building resilience, maintaining a positive mindset and pushing through challenges – no matter how tough it feels. In a school setting, this might look *like taking the time to break down steps of what* looks like a really long word problem, using feedback to produce a finished product that is edited in multiple ways, taking on a challenge of getting lost in a novel or pausing to think about a social situation before reacting. In a fast-paced world, resilience and optimism need to be taught. Supporting students in developing the skills for resilience is something that occurs each day when we model breaking down steps, set reminders for available strategies, build in conversation about the type of classroom community we want to have. As a school community, it is important that these conversations continue. Some strategies you can talk about at home are: Reflecting on what can be done differently the next time, prompting question with "what do you think?" and reinforcing the idea that "missteps" are how we grow. It always take a community to support our youth and together we can support them to respond in a world that needs fast-paced thinking with perseverance too.

Personal Device Policy



As you know, at Billy Green we follow the Ministry policy on personal device use. This means that personal devices such as personal iPads, cell phones can only be used with teacher's permission for the purpose of instruction. Recently, we have had a significant number of students using their devices without permission. What is more concerning is that students are using social media apps like SnapChat throughout the school day posting pictures of one another without permission and even posting pictures of educators. This is problematic as it is in breach of the Board's personal device policy and it also breach's policy regarding the use of social media in such a way that negatively impacts others or the school climate. Please remind your child that the use of personal devices during the school day is not permitted and will lead to suspension. Also, it is important that they understand the risks that apps like SnapChat can pose when they are invited into groups with others who they don't know. In March we will be welcoming Paul Davis, a social media expert, to speak with our junior and intermediate student.
