Equity Corner: Creating Belonging

Over the last two years, we have placed a strong focus on supporting student wellbeing. We have gathered student voice to understand what students wanted to see in our building. This led to physical changes to our space. Last June, we again gathered student voice and asked what they needed to feel like they belonged at Billy Green. These voices have focused on ensuring there is a strong focus on mental health, that compassion drives how we act and that adults provide a safe space. As a staff, we spent time looking at our data in order to define goals for this academic year. This year, we are placing a strong focus on BELONGING by honouring the various voices in our spaces, creating collaborative agreements, and offering texts and tasks that give us insight into not only who we are but also into the experiences of others. As part of our goal, we have created the "You are never alone" chart for students to access when they feel like they need to speak to an adult but they are not sure who to go to. These are posted throughout the school.



Every Brick Belongs

In keeping with our focus on BELONGING, our students created individual profile bricks. The brick included their name and images of how they see themselves. These are displayed in our front entryway in order to reinforce that although we are uniquely us – we all fit into Billy Green where we come together to grow.

PARKING Morning Entry

We have a very small parking lot and our priority is keeping our students safe as they enter into the playground in the morning. We ask for our families to support us in limiting traffic flow in the parking lot by not using this during morning and afterschool entry so that we can prioritize student safety and the entry of our staff and our busses as well. A reminder to please abide by street signs and be respectful to our community members. Kindly do not park on Paramount where it indicates no stopping or parking, and park on streets without blocking private driveways. Most of our school population lives in areas that are easily walkable, please consider using this mode in the morning. Thank you for your cooperation.



Reorganization NEW Classes

As I mentioned in my notice of September 19, each fall, the HWDSB reviews elementary student enrolment in schools and reorganizes staffing if actual enrolment differs from spring projections. It is typical for student enrolment to fluctuate. For our school, this resulted in a number of changes to our junior and FDK classes. This is never an easy process. We have planned a transition day for Thursday October 2nd so that students can meet their new teachers and classroom.

Please know that these decisions are made with careful consideration and respect for the needs of all students, and we are committed to making the transition as smooth as possible.

New classes begin on Friday October 3rd, 2025.
