"Chicks For Orphans in Africa Provides Great Gift Idea and Helps Zambians Become Financially Independent!"

One of our Junior Kindergarten Students and her dad had an idea for a school-wide project that we felt we had to take on! Their story of how it came about is below:



"My daughter Emma, just started JK in September. One day Emma and I were driving home from school and we got on the topic of Christmas and Santa and crumbs in his beard and then we had a lovely conversation about how we give gifts to people to show them that we love them. I said "Obviously we give gifts to our friends and family, because we love them, but sometimes we even give gifts to people we don't even know because we love everybody. What do you think about donating some baby chicks to people in Africa?"

Although to a 4 year old, donating baby chickens sounds silly, when I explained why, she agreed that it was something we should do. I challenged her with coming up with a number of how many we should donate. I assumed that her number would be between 1-20 because that's what she is most comfortable with and I could probably manage that. But her reply is the reason for this campaign. "Hmmm." she pondered a moment, "How about One Hundred and Eighty plus Thirty?!?" bubbling with excitement. Quick mental math brings us to 210 chicks at \$5/chick is \$1,050. We reached out to Mr. Playfair and the school council and they have supported this idea approving the opportunity to share love to those across the globe. We are asking for your support in helping Emma raise money for 210 Chicks. We will have a table at the Christmas Blizzard Baazar accepting donations and talking about the story and the work of Every Orphans Hope.

The not-for-profit organization Every Orphan's Hope strives to provide a sustainable source of income for an orphan-community in Zambia, Africa. ### STAND UP!

Speak Out! Help Break the Silence!

#### Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week was November 20-24, 2017

At Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board, the Safe Schools Survey suggests that at least once a week 8 per cent (2,742) of students are physically bullied, 16 per cent (5,485) are verbally bullied, 9 per cent (3,085) are socially bullied, and 3 per cent (1,028) are targeted online or by text message. This must stop.

HWDSB joined other Ontario school boards to recognize Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week (Nov. 20-24, 2017).

Here are some useful tips from HWDSB Social Work Services.

#### What can I do if my child is the victim of bullying?

Ask your child about what happens at school

Listen when they talk to you

Tell the school or childcare facility immediately and partner with them to address the problem.

Resist being overprotective.

Encourage your child to make friends outside of school.

Encourage your child to seek spare-time activities.

Teach children ways to resolve arguments without violent words or actions.

Talk about and practice assertiveness skills.

### What can I do if I suspect my child may be bullying others?

Take the problem seriously.

Talk to your child.

Tell your child that you will not tolerate this kind of behaviour.

Arrange for an effective, non-violent consequence.

Establish a few family rules and stick to them.

Spend more time with your child.

Increase your supervision of your child's activities and friends.

Partner with the school to address the problem.

Limit the amount of violent television and video games to which your child is exposed.

#### What can I do if I suspect my child may be a bystander to bullying?

Encourage your child to empathize with the victim; step into their shoes.

Help your child to understand that there is a difference between 'tattling' and 'reporting'.

Accompany your child to the teacher or principal if they decide to report what they have witnessed.

Encourage your child to mobilize his/her friends to join together to protect the victim.

Explain to your child that bullying does not 'toughen people up' but can cause real emotional and physical harm.

Encourage your child to find friends who value kindness and integrity.

Behave with kindness, integrity and courage yourself, whenever you have the opportunity.

Encourage your child when they accept responsibility for their own behaviour.

### SECURE SCHOOLS

At Buchanan Park School, we practice the "Secure Schools Procedure" twice during the school year. A Lockdown is used when there is a potential risk of harm to people within, or outside the school setting. Although one can never predict when a violent or potentially harmful situation may arise, schools can prepare for responding to such an incident through intentional, scheduled practices, much like what we do with Fire Drills.

We held the first of two Lockdown Practices on November 28th at 10:00 AM. The second practice will be in the Spring. The goal of the practice is to minimize the risk for staff and students during a time of crisis. In the event of a "real" lockdown, the Hamilton Police Services will be responding to the situation.

All staff, students and volunteers who are regularly in the school buildings are required to know the procedures. The students have had the Lockdown Procedures explained to them ahead of time and the school will practice this procedure a second time later this year.

The following terms and language will be used to ensure everyone is using the proper terminology.

# "HOLD AND SECURE" – Used when the school is secured due to an ongoing situation outside and <u>not related</u> to the school (e.g. bank robbery near a school)

- The school continues to function normally, with the exterior doors locked until the situation is resolved
- Staff member posted at each entrance
- All movement in and out of the school is restricted
- Exterior facing windows should be covered or blinds drawn, lights dimmed, where possible
- School most likely to be notified by Hamilton Police Services

# "SHELTER IN PLACE" – Used for an environmental, or weather related situation, where it is necessary to keep all occupants within the school to protect them (May be recommended by HES-Fire). Examples may include chemical spills, blackouts, explosions or extreme weather conditions

- People enter and remain in a building with the doors and windows closed
- Fans including heating and air conditioning units, should be turned off to prevent air from outside entering the building
- Normal operations may continue within the building

# "LOCKDOWN" – Used when there is a major incident or threat of school violence within the school, or in relation to the school

- Threat is inside the school, or is on school property, and poses an immediate threat to the students and staff
- Follow current lockdown procedures
- All movement in and out of the school and within the school is restricted
- Doors remain open to permit police immediate entry
- The "Safe Location" for our school is the Stoney Creek Recreation Centre

The above terminology is used to ensure consistency across the province. Common language across the province allows for easy integration when staff, students and other emergency service personnel are transferred from one jurisdiction to another.

Our practice went very well and students were serious, but not alarmed at the prospect of practicing this which is a big step. Along with this information having been presented at school, we encourage parents to talk with their children about the need to always be safe and well prepared for an emergency situation.

### Driving to School? Keep our Kids Safe!

Parents and caregivers who drive to and from school play an important role in keeping our kids safe. Pedestrian and cyclist safety begins with drivers.

Follow these safe driving tips:

Slow down and obey all traffic laws and speed limits.

Watch for children walking or cycling both on the road and the sidewalk.

**Obey the parking signs.** Comply with school drop-off and pick-up procedures. **Please park in the Church Lot.** Signs will be posted there saying "Park at your own risk", but we still have permission to use it!!

Avoid double parking or stopping on crosswalks. This blocks visibility for pedestrians and other motorists.

Be alert in bad weather. Snow, rain, and fog reduce visibility for both drivers and pedestrians.

Prepare to stop for a school bus when yellow lights are flashing.

**Stop for a school bus** when red overhead lights flashing, regardless of the direction from which the driver is approaching. Proceed only when the school bus begins to move and the red lights stop flashing

Watch for children near bus stops. Be alert for children arriving late for the bus. They may dart into the street without looking.

**Ready for a change?** Think about walking your kids to school just one day a week.

# Bus Reminder

Please be aware that according to HWSTS (Hamilton Wentworth Student Transportation System) policy, any kind of switches to a different route, or stop, or to have your child ride the bus one time for caregiving purposes or social engagements, ABSOLUTELY MUST be authorized in advance by the Principal of the school with written instructions on a separate paper (not in the agenda) listing all the particulars of the switch. Students who request these kinds of switches without written requests will be denied entry on to the bus (if usually a walking student) or will be put on their regular bus to disembark at their regular stop (if usually a bus rider)!

# Indoor Shoes Required

As the weather begins to change, we ask that all students bring a pair of indoor shoes that will be used throughout the school to keep the messy weather outside. We need to work together to keep our classroom carpets clean and in good condition so our children do not sit on wet, muddy carpets!

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### **Every Child Reading By the End of Grade 1**

At Buchanan Park, we're committed to supporting a goal where every child is reading by the end of Grade 1, **where developmentally appropriate.** A child who is reading by the end of Grade 1 is set up for positive academic outcomes and future success.

In September 2017, HWDSB celebrated the deployment of 48 Reading Specialists across the district to work directly with students and educators in all Kindergarten and Grade 1 classrooms.

Reading Specialists are working with children within classrooms, alongside classroom educators, to deliver appropriate strategies and/or interventions. They support reading acquisition and respond to student learning needs.

Bus cancellations and school closures

# How does HWDSB decide on bus cancellations and school closures?

- When bad weather is expected,
  Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation
  Services (HWSTS) carriers check weather reports,
  road conditions and road clearing, starting as early
  as 4 a.m.
- Based on this information, the Director of Education makes the decision in conjunction with Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board.





#### When do we make decisions?

HWDSB will announce the cancellation of school and board operations by <u>6</u> am. based on the best information at the time.

#### The HWDSB Rule:

Inclement weather
+ Bus cancellation
= No school

When HWDSB cancels busing due to inclement weather, we have deemed the roads unsafe and this triggers the closure of schools. Some boards have different procedures.





### What's the rule for extreme cold?

In extreme cold, buses may not start or run as expected and HWDSB may need to cancel transportation. But this **does not** automatically mean that schools will close. In 2014, Trustees gave the Director (or designate) the discretion to keep schools open when busing is cancelled due to extreme cold.
