## Kindergarten Communication of Learning Report Cards To Go Home with Grade 1-6 Progress Reports on October 30

The 2018-19 school year will be our second year using the new, written Kindergarten report provided by the Ministry of Education.

Issued on Oct. 30, 2018, the written document Kindergarten Communication of Learning: Initial Observations will be the first formal report of the year on your child's learning in Kindergarten. You can see the document online at http://bit.ly/2wQDjaR.

While this replaces observation visits, it aims to open home-school communication throughout the school year. The report includes clear, detailed, and straightforward information about your child's learning, growth in learning, and next steps in learning in relation to expectations in Kindergarten.

At HWDSB, each team of Kindergarten educators will schedule interviews with parents for all students in years one and two of the two-year Kindergarten program.

Thank you for choosing HWDSB for these Kindergarten years, which lay the foundation for your child's future achievements and success.

Student Safety in the Parking Lot/Reporting to Office when Entering the School As you know at HWDSB student safety is one of our utmost concerns. In order to keep students safe around the Parking Lot, we ask that parents dropping off, please pull over and stay on the ROAD. There is a sidewalk just beyond (EAST of) the parking lot entrance which goes directly to the playground. Please have students get out onto this sidewalk!

Also, to keep the building secure for all students, we must ask parents to say goodbye each morning either on the playground or, if you are coming late after your child's class line has entered the building, then at the Front Doors. We understand that a loving send off to school is important for all students and that the transition may be more difficult for some than for others, but Board policy is very clear that any adult in the building must have an ID tag on. For this reason we must ask that all parents refrain from entering the building in the morning through any other door but the Front door and that if you wish to visit in the hall, you must get a Volunteer sticker.

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### **Buchanan Park Staffing Changes**

On November 2, 2018, we will be saying Goodbye to two temporary teachers who have done a wonderful job here at Buchanan. When Ms. Loughridge and Ms. Klotz meet with Parents to discuss Progress Reports on Friday November 2nd, they will be doing their last official duties at Buchanan Park. We wish to thank them for the excellent work that they have done in their short time here.

When students return to school on Monday November 5th after the PA Day, we will welcome Mr. Neal as the teacher of our Grade 5/6 class and Mr. Calabrese as the teacher of our Junior Comprehensive Special Education Class.

### Safe and Secure School Drills

As in the past, we will be implementing our "Secure School Procedure" during this school year. Secure school procedures are used when there is a potential risk of harm to people within, or outside, the school setting. It is important that staff and students are prepared and know what to do should such a situation arise. It is equally important that parents and guardians know what would be happening in such situations.

The procedures in Hamilton-Wentworth District Schools have been developed in close consultation with the Hamilton Police Services.

A secure school situation is when direction for emergency response is required in the event of the following scenario:

Lockdown: A potential violent situation at the school

Hold and Secure: Safety situation in the neighbourhood external to the school

Shelter in Place: A potential environmental hazard outside the school

Bomb Threat: A report of or discovery of an expolosive device

For young children, this procedure will be presented in the same way we present information for a fire drill. Sometimes we can be safe by leaving the building; sometimes we can be safe by staying in our classrooms.

Fire drills are in place to quickly evacuate the building. Secure school procedures are in place to have children "get in" to classrooms, and "get down", away from windows and doors. Both procedures are in place to reduce the risk of harm in potentially threatening situations.

Principals are required to practice these procedures twice during each school year. We will have one practice in the fall and the second in the spring. We have tentatively planned for our fall practice to occur on Tuesday November 27<sup>th</sup>.

Along with the information being presented at school, we encourage parents to talk with their children about the need to always be prepared, and that sometimes we go out of buildings for safety, and sometimes we stay in the buildings for safety. As always, your support is much appreciated.



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### **HWDSB Volunteer Policy**

HWDSB's Volunteer Policy came into effect in 2015.

This Policy requires every Principal to interview Volunteer candidates and fill in the Volunteer Information Sheet and the School/Volunteer Agreement Form, and for all **NEW** volunteers to obtain a Police Check that is current within the last 6 months. After this initial Police Check is obtained, volunteers **without** a break in service will only need to update their Police Check **every 3 years**, but will need to fill out an **Offence Declaration Form** annually. If you are continuing to volunteer please obtain the Offence Declaration and hand it in to the office. If you are new to the school, then please drop by the office to get a volunteer package and set up an interview time with Mr. Playfair.
