## **Interested in volunteering?**



## Recess guardians

## Is your child at risk of school suspension due to missing vaccine records?

Hamilton Public Health Services is reviewing student vaccine records. The Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) is a law in Ontario that requires children attending school to be immunized against specific diseases. Vaccines required include diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, and meningococcal diseases. Failure to receive these vaccines can result in future school suspensions.

You are recommended to consult with a health care provider for more details about the requirements, and to review your child's vaccination status. Public Health Services might not have your child's updated vaccine records because parents/guardians need to report them to Public Health Services. Health care providers do not report these automatically.

You can report your vaccine(s) to Hamilton Public Health Services using one of these options:

When reporting, please include the following: Full Name, Address, Date of Birth, Phone Number, Health Card Number, Copy of the Vaccine Record

If your child requires a vaccine(s), the following options are available to you:

Family Doctor: Connect with your family doctor to ensure you child's vaccines are up to date.

Walk-in Clinic: if you do not have a family doctor but you have a health card or Public Health Community Clinic: book an appointment at Hamilton.ca/awaiting For more information visit School Screening and Suspensions. Page translation available.



## Unsafe drop off for our children

Central Elementary School can be safer for students, if there are less cars coming to the school. We can make it safer by not stopping in the parking lot or in front of the school. There is something simple we can do, it is called '**Drive to Five**.'

Try to park a block away from the school and walk with your child the rest of the way. With no cars at the school, the kids will be safer, more active, and the air around the school will be cleaner. The map below shows in **Green** the streets that are safe and legal to park on:

- Bold Street
- Park Street
- Duke Street

Students will be called down once you are here and it can take a few minutes for your child(ren) to gather there things and get to the office area. Please let your child(ren)s classroom teacher know, ahead of time, if you will be picking up early and the time so they can ensure that your child is ready.
