#### STUDENT SAFETY

Student safety remains our top priority, and we kindly ask for the community's continued support and awareness.

Please be mindful that during the school day—particularly during Nutrition Breaks—students are outside on the yard. To maintain a safe and secure environment, we ask that community members refrain from walking through the school grounds or waiting along the fence lines. Not all staff are familiar with every community member, and the presence of unknown adults can be concerning when it comes to keeping students safe.

If you are picking up your child during the day, please come directly to the school door and wait to be assisted by a staff member.

#### **END OF DAY PROCEDURES**

At dismissal, we've noticed increased congestion around the main entrance. This makes it challenging for staff to safely and efficiently ensure that each child is dismissed to the correct adult.

To help us maintain a safe and smooth end-of-day process, we kindly ask families to avoid gathering near the main doors. Instead, please wait for your child near the playground or by the portables.

We truly appreciate your cooperation and support in keeping our students and staff safe every day.

We have many fun upcoming events in the last few months of school. A reminder that if you have a student that will be starting school in the fall please ensure that you register them as soon as you can. We look forward to some better sunny days with lots of JOY continuing at Central.





# Activities at Centra/

#### Bracelet Club

#### Is your child at risk of school suspension due to missing vaccine records?

Hamilton Public Health Services is reviewing student vaccine records. The Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) is a law in Ontario that requires children attending school to be immunized against specific diseases. Vaccines required include diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, and meningococcal diseases. Failure to receive these vaccines can result in future school suspensions.

You are recommended to consult with a health care provider for more details about the requirements, and to review your child's vaccination status. Public Health Services might not have your child's updated vaccine records because parents/guardians need to report them to Public Health Services. Health care providers do not report these automatically.

You can report your vaccine(s) to Hamilton Public Health Services using one of these options:

When reporting, please include the following: Full Name, Address, Date of Birth, Phone Number, Health Card Number, Copy of the Vaccine Record

If your child requires a vaccine(s), the following options are available to you:

Family Doctor: Connect with your family doctor to ensure you child's vaccines are up to date.

Walk-in Clinic: if you do not have a family doctor but you have a health card or Public Health Community Clinic: book an appointment at Hamilton.ca/awaiting For more information visit School Screening and Suspensions. Page translation available.



#### Unsafe drop off for our children

Central Elementary School can be safer for students, if there are less cars coming to the school. We can make it safer by not stopping in the parking lot or in front of the school. There is something simple we can do, it is called '**Drive to Five**.'

Try to park a block away from the school and walk with your child the rest of the way. With no cars at the school, the kids will be safer, more active, and the air around the school will be cleaner. The map below shows in **Green** the streets that are safe and legal to park on:

- Bold Street
- Park Street
- Duke Street

#### **Interested in volunteering?**

Students and families with classroom concerns are encouraged to contact their student's classroom teacher as the first method of communication regarding the concern. It is with hope that this will rectify the situation before further escalation.

#### Early Pick-Up

It is important that your child remains at school until the final bell at 3:05 p.m. Please keep in mind, as a courtesy to teachers, the learning of students, and the office, which can be a very busy place, that early dismissals do cause interruptions to class. If you need to pick up your child from school early, due to an appointment, we remind you to please allow some extra time for your child to arrive at the office. Students will be called down once you are here and it can take a few minutes for your child(ren) to gather there things and get to the office area. Please let your child(ren)s classroom teacher know, ahead of time, if you will be picking up early and the time so they can ensure that your child is ready.
