Students at Chedoke celebrated "Pink Day—Stand-up for Bullying on April 12. It was a success. Pictures below.



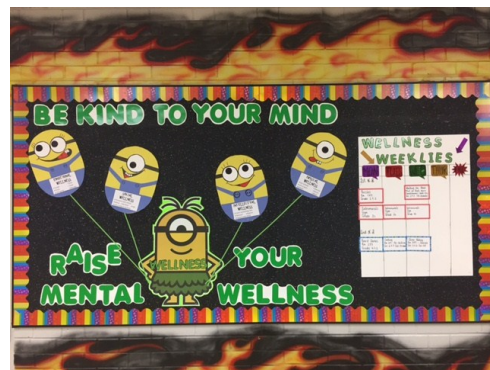
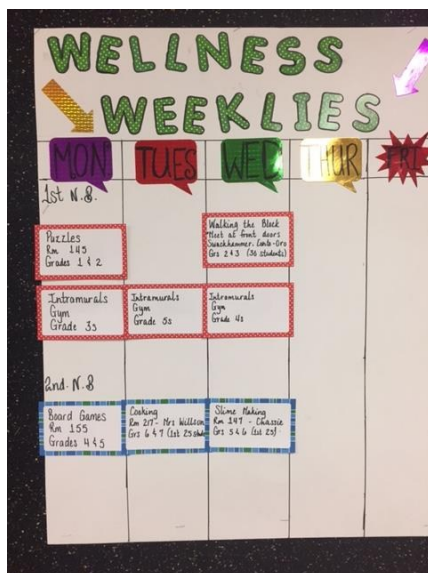

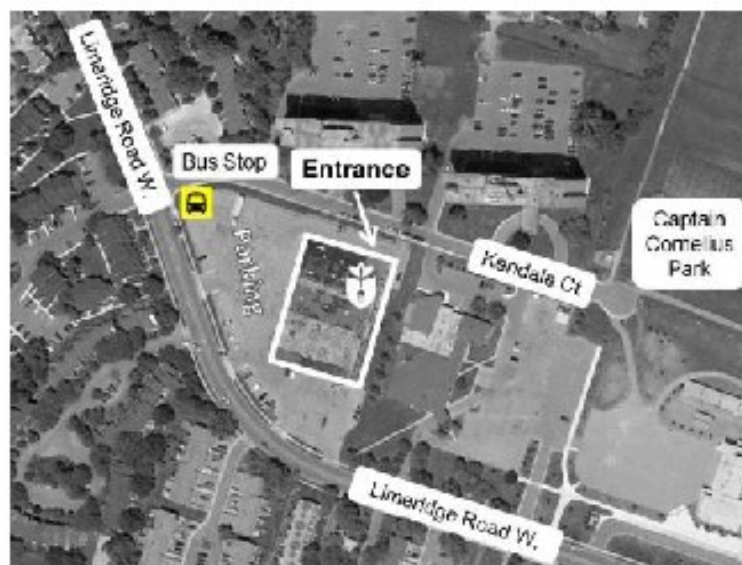
