

Heat Events

The City of Hamilton Public Health Department monitors weather forecasts closely and notifies the media and community partners of a heat event. A heat event occurs when the forecast calls for one or more days with a 40 or higher humidex reading. Once HWDSB has been notified of a heat event, information will be posted on our website and the following precautionary steps will be taken for students:

- Limit physical outdoor activities
- Ensure access to water
- Close drapes and blinds
- Move students through cooler areas of the school
- Monitor students for symptoms of heat stress



DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

Parents must be aware that according to the Dog Owner's Liability Act Bill 031 Bylaw 12-031, specifically 7.0 and Part 8.0 (effective January, 2012), if parents choose to walk their dogs on school property at entry time and dismissal time, they must acknowledge that they will be held responsible for their dogs' behaviour.
