
2018 Chedoke Elementary Fund-raiser;

HWDSB is offering students the opportunity to receive full eye exams during school hours. Every child is eligible for one yearly eye examination covered by OHIP, so this service is offered free of charge. The target of this initiative is children who are NOT CURRENTLY SEEING AN OPTOMETRIST ON A YEARLY BASIS and especially children who have NEVER HAD THEIR EYES EX-

AMINED by an Optometrist. This service is run by Vision Works, which offers a mobile optometric service that will visit your child's school. The eye exams will consist of the following tests:

- Measuring your child's current vision
- Testing colour vision and depth perception
- Assessing the ability of the eye muscles to work together
- Measuring pupil function and size
- Testing for glasses
- Using a microscope to assess the health of the eye



Vision Works will be coming to Chedoke doing eye testing on February 15, 20, 21st.

Your child will be bringing home a permission form on purple paper within the next week to be completed and returned to the school.
