Tutors are available during the school year 5:30 to 9:30 ET from Sunday to Thursday. Homework Help tutors will help students understand mathematical concepts they started learning in class.

During severe winter weather, the difficult decision to remain open or to close is always made with the safety and security of our students and staff in mind. Here are some guidelines to remember:

Weather Cancellations When bad weather is expected,

Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation Services (HWSTS) carriers check weather reports, road conditions and road clearing, starting as early as 4 a.m. Based on this information, the Director of Education makes the decision in conjunction with Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board. HWDSB will announce the cancellation of school and board operations by 6 am. based on the best information at the time.

<u>Where to look:</u> We share this announcement on the HWDSB website, HWDSB's Twitter account and on the HWSTS website. We also contact local media outlets including CHCH TV, CHML and the Hamilton Spectator. HWDSB makes a decisions by 6 am.

No School: School boards have varied policies on cancellations:

The HWDSB Rule is: Severe weather + Bus cancellation = No school. When HWDSB cancels busing due to inclement weather, we have deemed the roads unsafe and this triggers the closure of schools.

Extreme Weather In extreme cold, buses may not start or run as expected and HWDSB may need to cancel transportation. But this does not automatically mean that schools will close. The Director (or designate) has discretion to keep schools open when busing is cancelled due to

extreme cold. A school cancellation is a tough decision and some families may disagree with HWDSB's call. Families can always make the choice they feel is best when it comes to sending their child to school.

COLD WEATHER & OUTDOOR PLAY

As we enter into the winter months, we will continue to play outdoors at different times throughout the day. Please be sure that your child comes to school dressed properly for the weather. <u>Boots</u>, <u>mittens or gloves</u>, <u>hat and winter outerwear</u> are necessary for students to enjoy their time outdoors. It is also a good idea to sent an <u>extra pair of socks and mittens just in case the first pair get wet</u>. To help keep the classroom floors dry and safe, parents are asked to <u>send a</u> <u>pair of indoor only shoes</u> for their child to change into when they come inside. As always, Principals use their professional judgement and HWDSB guidelines to determine when students will stay inside for nutrition breaks. Guidelines recommend that students remain inside when the thermometer dips below –15 C (-20 C with the wind chill). Please remind your children that remaining inside during recess is not an option (for supervision and safety reasons) unless an indoor recess has been called by the Principal.
