Land Acknowledgement:

The Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board acknowledges our presence on ancestral Anishinaabe and Haudenosaunee Confederacy land as determined by the Dish with One Spoon treaty.

The Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt represents the treaty relationship between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and Anishinaabe with respect to sharing the land and resources thereon.

Lifetouch (Guest speaker):

Veronica Robinson provides an introduction to Lifetouch photography and welcomes any feedback from Parents as to how "photo day" went and if there is anything they could do better.

• Working closely with Public Health and the Board, following Covid safety protocols and physical distancing. Students enter and receive a gown. Every gown is sanitized and steamed after each use. When the

student is positioned for the photo, they can remove their mask. Everything that is touched is sanitized. The process takes longer but was a success overall.

- Upcoming photo sessions March 25th for Kindergarten and April 22nd for rest of the school. No group images are allowed due to Covid-19.
- Any suggestions on what we can to do as an alternative? Kristina yearbook concept? This is called "Class composite".
- Would you like the names of the student underneath? First name and last name initial only or just first name? Mark had planned to discuss this closer to the time. It seems that most people would like the first name included and perhaps just the first initial of the last name, for privacy reasons.
- The packages are the same as last year with the exception of the roses. They can't be sanitized.
- Families with financial issues Kristina to let Veronica know the names of the students who were not able to order the photos for financial reasons.
- Weekend appointments are available for retake sessions, with a focus on graduation students.
- How long are photos of the students kept? All photos are kept on file for 18 months as per Canadian privacy law.
- Mark thanked Veronica for her dedication. She kept in touch regularly and has gone above and beyond
 for the students and staff at Chedoke. A heartfelt thanks for contributing to the creation of memories for
 our students and their families.
- Sherry added, Veronica is amazing and it was a pleasure to deal with her.

<u>Treasurer Report:</u> Discrepancy of \$173.53 from iPads. January meeting minutes have not been approved. Emma needs clarification and a breakdown on what was purchased vs. what was approved. Currently there is zero funds in the account.

Principal Report:

Enhanced Protocols

Staff, students and children with **any new or worsening symptom** of COVID-19, as indicated in the school and childcare screening tool, even those with only one symptom, must stay home until:

- They receive a negative COVID-19 test result.
- They receive an alternative diagnosis by a health care professional, or
- It has been 10 days since their symptom onset and they are feeling better.

Previously, students with a minor symptom could return after 24 hours.

If you live with someone who has a new COVID-19 symptom, you must isolate for 14-days pending the symptomatic person's COVID-19 test result. This applies to siblings of symptomatic students or children of symptomatic parents/guardians.

For homes with more than one child, this means that all students in a household must stay home if a single student fails the screen; all siblings will be sent home from school if one child becomes ill.

If you live with an international traveler who is not exempt from quarantine requirements, you must isolate for 14-days.


