ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY – CHEDOKE SCHOOL'S DIGITAL CONTRACT

The school will provide access to school-owned electronic devices as resources permit. Staff will not handle, collect or store personal devices. Staff will deal with improper use of devices in accordance with Chedoke Code of Conduct and Progressive Discipline policy. For example, staff can ask students to put away a device if student is using it inappropriately, and continued inappropriate use of device may result in an office referral. The Principal / Vice-Principal may confiscate and securely store personal electronic devices until the end of the school day at their discretion. Staff will not examine the contents of personal devices.

Parents / Guardians / Students Rights and Responsibilities

Students / parents / guardians are responsible for reading Chedoke's policy and their signature indicates agreement with its terms. Parents and guardians are responsible for choosing if their student will bring a personal device to school. Students / parents / guardians are responsible for the care and security of their device while at school. **The school assumes no responsibility for lost, stolen or damaged devices.**

All students will adhere to Chedoke Code of Conduct when it comes to use of their personal and school devices. Consequences for improper use will be consistent with Chedoke's Code of Conduct and Progressive Discipline policy.

Instructional vs. Non-Instructional Time

Instructional: Device may be used during instructional time for educational or emergency purposes only at the discretion of the teacher. Phones will be kept on silent. Staff will follow the same guidelines.

Non-instructional: Personal devices may be used during non-instructional times. If the staff member deems the device is being used

inappropriately, the student may be asked to put it away. Staff members have the right to determine the appropriateness of all

content. Final decision on appropriate use falls to the principal / vice-principal. If further discipline is required, the staff will adhere

to Chedoke's codes governing appropriate behaviour and progressive discipline steps. Use of school supported devices during non-

instructional time will only be allowed with direct teacher supervision.

Cell phones MAY NOT be used:

1. To call or text a family member during instructional time.

- 2. To call or text a friend during instructional time.
- 3. To record audio or video, unless given permission by a staff member for a school related assignment.
- 4. To bully or harass another student or staff member.
- 5. To share inappropriate content with another student or staff member.

Consequence / Enforcement

Inappropriate use of devices will be treated as any other problematic behaviours; i.e., in accordance with the school's Progressive Discipline policy (follows normal discipline for other classroom issues; e.g., being disrespectful to staff, running around at lunch, hands-on behaviour, etc.).

Standards of Good Practice


Chedoke School recognizes that staff play an important role in educating and empowering students to become exemplary digital citizens. Chedoke's approach to educating students begins with the premise that technology is a valuable learning resource and that students and teachers are co-learners in the classroom. Making compromises with students is a good way to meet the needs of students and staff members. It is important for staff members to use digital resources effectively and to elevate student capability around their use rather than restricting use based on improper use by a few. The focus of teaching in the area of digital citizenship will be on areas such as online privacy and identity, digital information sharing, digital footprint, care and safe use of devices, and the impact on school culture.

The Chedoke Acceptable Use Policy is directly connected, and relates to the HWDSB Use of Digital Technology Procedure.





Summer INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE Programs

Summer International Language Programs provide an opportunity for students in Elementary School to develop and/or maintain the ability to speak, listen, read and write in a new language or the language of their heritage.

Program runs July 4 to 28, 2023

Eligibility: Students currently in grade 9-12 and Adult learners are eligible to attend7.8
