

Snow-clearing at HWDSB Schools

A responsibility shared by Board staff, contractors and the City of Hamilton





HWDSB Staff

Clear, salt and/or sand...

- walkways from the city sidewalk to the school
- school steps and portable steps
- walkways to the portables
- ramps to schools and portables
- area outside entrances and Fire Exit Doors
- Fire Exit stairs & ramps



HWDSB Contactors

After 5cm+ of snow, will...

- Plow parking lots and sidewalks when HWDSB Facilities staff deem it necessary
- Salt and sand the parking lot before school starts
- If required, Head Caretakers may also salt or sand parts of the parking lot



City of Hamilton

Responsible for clearing...

- Snow and ice from sidewalks directly in front of schools, a top priority for the City.
- Note: It may take up to 24 hours after a snowfall for sidewalks to be cleared. Report a sidewalk fronting a school in need of clearing at 905-546-CITY (2489)

What about playgrounds?

Playgrounds *are not* plowed or cleared. Head Caretakers inspect playgrounds and sand and/or salt areas made slippery by changing temperatures.

Students, take extra caution when walking or playing on school property that may be slippery. Principals concerned about weather or playground conditions may hold indoor recesses and lunch/nutrition breaks.





Benefits of outdoor play

Time spent outdoors is an integral part of the school day. There are great benefits when children experience **fresh air**, **exercise and time spent time outside**. Outdoor play is also a break from the structure of the classroom.

Preparing for the outdoors

It's important that children come to school **prepared for the cold**. This means boots, mittens/gloves, hats and even extra mittens and socks in case they are needed.

When is it too cold for outdoor play?

Principals decide whether to send students outside for recess. HWDSB asks Principals to follow the City of Hamilton guideline that we stay inside when it's at or **below -15C, or -20C with wind chill.**

Sharing the knowledge: Parent Reaching Out Grant (Pro Grant)

The Parents Reaching Out Grants (Pro Grant) program provides funding to school boards to provide opportunities for School Councils, the Parent Involvement Committee (PIC) and the school community to lead projects that support parent/guardian/caregiver engagement and align with at least one of the following objectives:

- Addressing social inclusion and racism specifically anti-Asian, anti-Black, and anti-Indigenous racism and other prejudices toward racialized and marginalized groups
- Creating a safe and welcoming environment
- Demonstrating respect for parents as valued partners within the education system regarding decisions about their child's education
- Enhancing communication with teachers
- Informing parents about the expectations of the Ontario Curriculum and supporting resources.

Applications that meet the criteria are eligible for a maximum amount of \$1,000. Schools may develop applications individually, or with another school. If schools choose to collaborate on an event, they can submit one application and combine funding. Individuals from the school

community who have ideas for projects or initiatives that they would like considered, are encouraged to connect with their School Council or Principal.

Project Guidelines and Activities

- Activities must follow all Public Health measures and HWDSB procedures. Should conditions change and revisions to applications be requested, please contact PIC@hwdsb.on.ca
- Activities will support School Council initiatives or initiatives in partnership with community organizations
- Activities will identify and address local barriers to parent engagement and may include but are not limited to:
- Development of parent resources (e.g. leadership resource for parents, resources addressing well-being, mental health, and anti-racism for students and families, etc.)

Please see the included application package for information regarding the PRO Grant application process for the 2022-2023 school year.

Information should be shared with School Councils as soon as possible to encourage discussion and consideration for projects related to supporting parent/guardian/caregiver engagement.

The maximum funding per school is \$1000 and the due date for applications is January 27th, 2023. The application must have the signature of both the School Council Chair and the Principal.

Timelines

- Delivery of parent information sessions (e.g. how to support children and families at home, how to understand curriculum, etc.)
- Delivery of parent engagement sessions (e.g. parent networking sessions)
- Innovative activities that enable enhanced and diversified parent engagement.
- November January: School Councils provide input to the Principal regarding the focus and scope of the activities
- January 27, 2023 PRO Grant applications due, please send completed applications to PIC@hwdsb.on.ca
- February 24, 2023 follow up communication with schools
- June 30, 2023 projects must be completed and funding spent
