4.0 School Report presented by Denise Minardi, Principal and is attached (Appendix A).

4.1 Loblaws **gift cards** presented by Louise vanderPut. 5.1 Treasure report presented by Lynda Brewer and attached (Appendix B)

Home & School Association is a member of the Ontario Federation of Home & Schools and must abide by their overarching guidelines as well as our own By-Laws. i. Lunch Clubs

Read-a-thon is underway, and classes are participating. Thank you to Veronica Riemer who volunteered to update the form and count the number of minutes per class. There will be a draw for a pizza party prize for one class from Kindergarten, Primary and Junior.

iii. Dance-a-thon

Dance-a-thon is being planned for February 23. There is a parent volunteer (Ashley Francis) that has volunteered to lead it. A motion to change the name of the Dance-a-thon to the Move and Groove-a-Thon was made to make it more inclusive. All were in favour.

iv. Staff Appreciation Lunch

Staff Appreciation Lunch is February 13th during Staff Appreciation Week. On this day, we ask parents to donate a dish and provide lunch for the staff at the school as a thank you for all they do. We are looking for volunteers to provide a side dish, salad main dish or dessert. Donations should contain no nuts, pork or shellfish. Vegetarian, vegan and gluten-free options are welcome. 5.4 Arts Council Update

Artist in the Classroom for Grade 5s is currently underway. Feedback has been positive. The group has a lead on an artist for the Grade 2s and is currently working through details of the project.

5.5 Outdoor Space

We are still looking for someone to lead this group. The commitment would be to coordinate a spring and fall volunteer clean up/work day. In addition, this role would communicate with the school and Home & School about equipment or maintenance needs and help to inform any spending on the outdoor space. 5.6 Healthy Snack Program

The Healthy Snack Program ran out of funding from Tastebuds. More funding has been requested, but will be issued in instalments and not fully issued until later in March. Even with the additional funding, more is needed to see the program through until the end of the year. A motion to give the Healthy Snack Program \$500 from Home & School budget was made.

6.1 PRO grant update

We have money for a PRO (Parents Reaching Out) grant. This is to be used for Pathways to Success programing, focusing on how the education system works from K-12. This includes what parents can do in K-8 to help foster success in grades 9-12, along with the different pathways available in high school. Parents in attendance filled out a survey about their interest in this topic to help determine an appropriate speaker/event for the Cootes Paradise Parent community. There was some verbal feedback that focusing on high school pathways was maybe a bit premature for parents of younger students and perhaps something with a younger student focus would be a better fit.

7.0 New Business

7.1 Classroom to Parent Communication

There was a concern about lack of communication between classroom teachers and parents. Denise confirmed that the expectation is a monthly communication. If parents are concerned they should speak directly to the teacher and if nothing is done, to bring it up to Denise and she will address them one to one about it.

7.2 Crossing Guard Absenteeism

There was a concern expressed about the lack of a crossing guard in front of the school across King St., which is a very busy crossing without a light or stop sign. Parents are encouraged to call the City at 905-546-2200 to express their concern.

7.3 First Lego League

An interested parent, Isabelle Ekwa-Ekoko, came forward with interest into starting a First Lego League program at Cootes Paradise School. Isabelle has been in touch with Louise VanderPut about the feasibility of starting a league at Cootes Paradise. There are significant costs involved and only a small number of children can participate, but feedback from Denise, who had a program at Prince Philip, was that the students really enjoyed it. Louise and Isabelle will report back once there is more information to share.

Appendix B: Treasure Report

As of Jan 30 2018, YTD Revenue for initiatives is approximately \$15,776. This amount includes:

- \$6,685 from Pita and Pizza lunches, which is overstated as it does not reflect all offsetting expenses yet
- \$6,333 from the Night Hike
- \$40 from prior year's QSP Magazine Sales
- \$1835 from current year's QSP Magazine Sales
- \$69 from Mabels Labels which we didn't receive at all last year
- \$231 Net proceeds from Outdoor Movie Night
- \$186 from Popcorn and juice sales at the Open House
- \$397 from the Winter Concert Bake Sale

As of January 30, YTD expenditures on initiatives total just over \$5536, of which includes \$1,565 for DPA equipment, \$271 for playground line painting, 2 performances for \$1831, IN reach and Healthy Snack program \$354, office expenses for \$88, Lunch Club costs for \$107, Outdoor space \$71 and Artist in the Classroom for the Arts Council of \$1,248.

The Net balance of \$3152 has been collected for FDK Pizza fund but it is independent from our budget.

Bank balance at Jan 30, 2018 is \$42,455.74 and we also have \$200 cash float and \$2500 tucked away in a GIC. Total H&S Assets at November 27th are approximately \$45,156 (= \$42,456 bank balance + \$200 float + \$2500 GIC).

The GIC was invested in February of 2017 and is maturing on May 7, 2018. At that time, we will need to decide if we want to reinvest that amount, add to the principal balance and reinvest or add the proceeds from the fund back to the operational budget for the current year.
