Please note that Picture Day will be on **Monday**, **October 7th!** All details regarding Picture Day were sent home with each student.




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MEDICAL ALERT

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Olympian Eleanor Harvey Visits Cootes Paradise



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Active School Travel



Did you know:

- 67% of our students live within walking distance of the school and only 39% actually walk
- 33% of our students are eligible for HWSTS bussing and only 22% take the bus
- 29% of our student population are being driven to Cootes Paradise every day

(Data = 2018/2019 Cootes Paradise)

We are so fortunate to live in Westdale! It's such a walkable neighbourhood with lots of conveniences easily accessible by walking or cycling.

Cootes Paradise was fortunate to be chosen for the Parent Engagement Strategy Pilot Project. A few of our Cootes Paradise School parents have been working with the City of Hamilton to develop a strategy to get more kids walking or wheeling to school.

The goal is to increase the number of parent champions for active school travel, and increase the number of students and their families using active school travel.
