		Upon questions from parents, Ms. Hogan confirmed that:	
		<ul> <li>Cootes Paradise Elementary School has been allotted 6 EAs for 2023-2024; however, only has 5 as of September 26<sup>th</sup>.</li> </ul>	
		<ul> <li>The vacant position is currently active. Ms. Hogan followed up again today to inquire about the status of the position.</li> </ul>	
		• The EA numbers went from 6 to 3 in 2022-2023 due to absences and a lack of new applicants.	
		• No students have been asked to stay home so far this year.

Chair's Report	<ul> <li>Ms. van Staalduinen reported on the following:</li> <li>Provided a summary on what School Council is (an important advisory body to the school and school board, and a cooperative body of parents, staff, and others in the community) as well as the importance of School Council (helps improve student achievement by placing student interests first, establishing positive relationships with the school principal and staff, increasing accountability of the education system to parents, promotes effective, ongoing communication among all partners in education, and advised the principal/trustee/superintendent in making decisions).</li> <li>The main activities undertaken by the 2022-2023 School Council (SC).</li> </ul>	Ms. van Staalduinen
5. Treasurer's Report	<ul> <li>Ms. Thomson reported on the following:</li> <li>HWDSB Parent Engagement Fund (\$500) has already been deposited to the school's account.</li> <li>The final SC numbers will be posted online shortly.</li> </ul>	Ms. Thomson
6. Principal's Report	<ul> <li>Ms. Hogan reported on the following:</li> <li>There was a smooth and wonderful transition to the 2023-2024 school year.</li> <li>The school is currently undergoing reorganization.</li> <li><i>Cootes Paradise Elementary</i> received its EQAO results: reading (80.6%), writing (62.5%), and math (59.5%).</li> <li>Thank you to the outgoing SC!</li> <li>Upon questions from parents, Ms. Hogan confirmed that: <ul> <li>The EQAO results were discussed in a staff meeting.</li> <li>There has been a big positive jump in math and this will continue to be a focus in 2023-2024.</li> <li>The school is looking for more math resources and has had good success with "Knowledge Hook."</li> <li>The school will continue to integrate math and reading learning opportunities.</li> <li>The Kindergarten curriculum remains play based, and Grades 1-3 as well as Grades 4 &amp; 5 will have their own plans.</li> <li>Scores have gone down since pre-COVID due to COVID and the electronic approach, introduced last year.</li> <li>Last year's math score was in the low 40's.</li> <li>Limited information on all Ontario schools' EQAO results is available on the Ministry of Education's website.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Ms. Hogan

	Representative's Report	<ul> <li>The assembly for safe/active play went well.</li> <li>Primary and Juniors have recess at separate times, which has made for less congestion on the playground.</li> <li>A board specialist is coming to the Kindergarten rooms and getting them what they need.</li> <li>Upon questions from parents, Ms. Dumitru confirmed that: <ul> <li>Staff and students are enjoying the new split Primary/Junior recess times.</li> <li>Staff and students seem to be adjusting to the new nutrition break times and that all students have the flexibility to get some food from their lunch boxes or from the snack bin prior to nutrition break, as needed.</li> <li>Kindergarten students now have centres outside and clear routines. A newsletter is going out from all Kindergarten teachers.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
8.	Home and School Association's Report	<ul> <li>Ms. Jessop reported the following:</li> <li>The first meeting of Home and School Association (HSA) is directly following tonight's SC meeting.</li> <li>There's a \$20 membership fee for HSA members, which is refunded at the end of the year. The fee covers insurance.</li> <li>The "Chalk and Talk" event on September 24<sup>th</sup> was a success.</li> <li>"Night Hike" is coming up on October 27<sup>th</sup>. Volunteers (with vulnerable sector checks) are needed to help carve in classrooms.</li> <li>HSA paid for bus subsidies for the school and gave donations to community organizations in 2022-2023.</li> <li>HSA came out in the black last year; they have money to spend at the school.</li> <li>Voting members can make decisions on the allocation of funds.</li> <li>The "Book Swap" in May 2023 was an excellent event, made some money, and all of the extra books were donated.</li> </ul>	Ms. Jessop

## Summary of Freedom Of Information (FOI) Request

In March 2023, a School Council member requested records from HWDSB via a FOI request related to (1) the allocation of EAs within HWDSB and (2) requests for additional EA support at Cootes Paradise Elementary School ("Cootes Paradise" or the "School").

On May 18, 2023, a substantive response to the request was received. 52 records were identified, 11 records were fully disclosed. Many were partially (20) or completely (27) redacted to protect personal privacy interests and/or employment information. Of note, we received the following:

- documents showing how many EAs were allocated to each HWDSB school in 2022-2023 school year (range from 2-19, CP is identified as having 6 EAs)
- a copy of the rubric used to allocate educational assistants within the HWDSB, which the HWDSB stated was only one tool used
- emails relating to EA allocation within the HWDSB and Cootes Paradise specifically
- emails sent by our administration at Cootes Paradise to HWDSB from June 2022 to February 2023, requesting more EA support
  - Emails from the School administration to HWDSB in June 2022 requesting that Cootes
     Paradise have its EA allotment increased from 6 to 7 EAs
  - An email from the School administration on August 29<sup>th</sup> 2022 to HWDSB, indicating that the School had to be creative in terms of stretching the six EAs to meet current needs, including by taking away a EA from one of their current students to meet the needs of incoming kindergarten classes
  - Early September 2022 emails from School administration indicating that there are four students without any shared support who previously had it and that there is no assigned Specialized Services Learning Consultant to Cootes Paradise
  - Emails from School administration to HWDSB in mid October 2022 indicating that they are unable to support the level of need and have had to reduce the length of the day of new students to ensure student and staff safety
  - Board emails from mid October 2022 indicating that they are posting a transitional LTO EA role for Cootes Paradise
  - An email from the School administration to HWDSB in late October 2022, indicating that Cootes Paradise is down to 3 EAs and requesting that an additional EA to be directed to the School
  - An email from the School administration to HWDSB in November 2022, indicating that they only have 4 EAs at Cootes Paradise and no one is applying to the EA job posted to LTO status.
  - Emails from January 2023 from School administration to HWDSB indicating that:
    - Cootes Paradise was down to 3 EAs
    - School cannot meet safety and toileting needs of students
    - Some classes were not able to attend the library or gym as a result
    - School is "continuing with [Board's] recommendation to rotate through letting parents know we have no support for their child should they choose to send them to school."
- internal emails regarding media interest in the EA allocation issue
