- School clubs?

- Will be selling COBS bread cards in January
- Little library→ hoping to partner with Westdale high to have it built
 - Was approved 2 years ago, going to try and have it purchased this year
 - NG can talk to her neighbor who is the shop teacher at Westdale high
- Popcorn sales will continue in term 2
- Skate and bake
 - Right now aiming for the last weekend of March
 - Money will be used for the grade 5 trip
- \$1000 to use towards Cootes families facing food insecurity issues over the holiday break
 - There is a waitlist of families waiting to be approved by Food for Kids
 - NG question- can we approve a higher amount?
 - Advised by admin there are fewer families on the waitlist this year- 4 families
 - NP question- was there feedback on whether groceries were helpful?
 - Admin advised that not one family who didn't capitalize on generosity
 - Sara Alves will prepare a list on what was well received- send out to the families, and then purchase based on the comments

- Clothing swap planned for the spring
- Bike swap planned for the spring
- RM (communications) is applying for grants to help fund outdoor initiatives
 - Canada Post

- Buddy bench \$2500- this is an bullying initiative- signals other friends to come over
- Twist and turn
 - This is phase 2 of the playground \$11500 (pavement already complete with the current construction happening)
- Kinderpen- taking phased approach, quoting in press
 - Safety surfacing is the biggest cost
 - Trying to find natural natural materials proposal- doesn't require safety surfacing
 - There is a company locally that does the rubberized ground- Safescapes
 - Comment from NP- from idea to execution seems to take a year with the approvals required by the board
 - Recommend approving by the HSA early and then submitting to the board and the company for quotes so that it is ready to go for next spring
