Dear Parents/Guardians:

Ms. Szabo retired on March 31st. I would like to thank her for all her work with the students over the past few years and wish her well in her retirement. Ms. Szabo will be replaced by Ms. Little for the remainder of the school year.

Health and Physical Education: Mr. DiFelice and Mr. Mayner will be completing the Health unit on Growth and Development over the next two months. Letters were recently sent home with students. If you wish to review the curriculum and resources, a copy of the documents is available in the main office during regular office hours (8:05-4:05).

We are working through the staffing process for next year. The number of students in the school in 2019-2020 will be similar to this year and the number of classes will remain the same (in both English and French streams). More information will be provided as we continue the process.

Our Attendance Reporting System is Changing

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school every day. To improve our safe arrival process, we are adding a new system that will make it easier for you to report – and respond to – your child's school absences.

Once it is deployed on **April 23rd**, SafeArrival will let you use a website, mobile app, or an interactive toll-free phone number to report an absence in advance. This will save time when a school needs to verify student attendance, and when notifying families of unexpected or unplanned absences.

An email address is required to log in to SafeArrival and to receive notifications. HWDSB will be contacting by phone all families that did not list an email address in their child's student record. This new, automated SafeArrival process is part of the SchoolMessenger notification system from West Corporation, a company used by many Canadian school boards. There is also a new SchoolMessenger mobile app for iOS and Android devices. It will be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to make it convenient for you to report future absences. March 1, Professional Development Day: On March 1 we looked at our Continuous Learning and Improvement Process. Two areas we looked at were academic achievement and positive culture and wellbeing. Regarding academic achievement, we looked at how to meet the needs of different learners and how students with accommodations and modifications can have their needs met through leveraging their strengths. This is particularly important given that our Learning Resource Teachers (LRTs) now go into classrooms to collaborate with teachers rather than having students withdrawn. This in-class support also helps address feelings students may have of being singled out when they leave the room. Having a LRT in the room enables them to help various students, not only those with accommodations and modifications, and the collaboration provides classroom teachers with a variety of new strategies to potentially help all students. On positive culture we looked at the survey data which told us that students at Dalewood who feel they have two or more important adults in the school is at 40%. We discussed this and decided to set a target of 63% of students indicating that they have two or more important adults in the building by June 2020.

<u>TVOMathify:</u> (tvomathify.com) is available free to all grade 7 and 8 students in publicly-funded schools in Ontario. Live tutors are available every Sunday-Thursday, 5:30-9:30 to help students consolidate their classroom learning. To register, students only need their OEN number. If you do not have your child's OEN number, please contact the school office.

<u>Drills:</u> We have carried out three fire drills, one Lockdown, a Hold and Secure, and a Shelter in Place this year. The drills have all gone well. Fire drills and a bomb threat drill are scheduled for the spring.
