Chair's Report	Bill Heinrich Reported:  Clarified the role of Council from the regulations  PRO (Parent Reaching Out) Grant Applications designed to engage parents. Up to \$1K. Deadline Nov 22
	<ul> <li>One drawback of past PRO grants is that a lot of work goes into bringing in a speaker and few attend.</li> <li>Ideas were brainstormed under New Business</li> </ul>
New Business	To Brainstorm ideas to apply for the Parents Reaching Out (PRO) Grant:  Food Theme (11 Votes)  Teaching about food sustainability  Inviting a chef who can model healthy seasonal cooking  Hosting a local farmer's market, perhaps w/ prepared foods + talks  Tie this into the Maker Space: growing plants/student garden/greenhouse  Involve foods and families of different cultures
	<ul> <li>Transportation Theme (4 votes)</li> <li>Transportation modes to school like the Columbian Cyclovia festival</li> <li>Art/Garden Theme (4 votes)</li> <li>Engage parents in designing an art or garden project.</li> <li>Hire a community artist to paint a mural on the wall</li> <li>Games Day / Week Theme (was tabled to non-grant ideas)</li> <li>A sports/fair/circus/arts day/ week for kids and parents to come together and play</li> </ul>

Anti-Bullying Theme (was tabled to non-grant ideas) Invite a professional to speak about bullying. It was named that the teachers are receiving this education currently Additional notes shared about the grant: \$500 for school parent community engagement could be used with the PRO grant It was clarified that staff don't have to attend the parent engagement activity Action Taken: Bill, Christine, Sweni, and Vanessa volunteered to form a subcommittee to write and submit a PRO grant application on the theme of Food because it received the most votes. It was named that we could still decide to pursue the other ideas as part of council priorities outside of the granting process: Transportation, Art/Garden, and/or Anti-Bullying. In the process of brainstorming ideas for the PRO Grant, ideas also emerged about how to engage / support the students: Ideas related to both feeding kids and educating kids about food were suggested: Rodrigo suggested bringing food from the farm once weekly to serve the kids a breakfast / snack/ lunch and also to have a farmer engage with the kids to educate McQuesten Urban Farm has teachers, Grade 8s are keen to visit Point of information: About 20-25 students in our school community receive food bags for the weekends. Funding from TasteBuds and another program (missed the name) support our efforts to feed students Summary of Action Taken: Natalia offered to take the lead on collecting donated items Actions Taken for the Maker Space using the neighborhood gifting group Action Taken: Bill, Christine, Sweni, and Vanessa volunteered to form a subcommittee to write and submit a PRO grant application on the theme of Food because it received the most votes. **Future Business** Priority Goals for Council – it was named that a number of ideas emerged today including the idea of engaging the school community around themes of food, transportation, art/gardening, and anti-bullying. Snacks It was named by Principal Hopkins that snacks are eligible to be purchased for School Council with the \$500 for school parent community engagement. However, a brief discussion yielded that snacks are not a high priority for school council and the money

	would be better spent elsewhere, for example, in conjunction with the PRO grant. We will discuss this again as needed.
