A Reminder About Personal Device Use at School

Students are welcome to bring their personal electronic devices to school with parent permission, but need to use them responsibly. Students are responsible for the use and storage of their devices at all times. The school is not responsible for any loss or damage to personal electronic devices. Students may only use these devices outside (for game playing only) or if a teacher asks students to use them for instructional purposes during class time. At all other times, these devices must be turned off and put away unless given permission to use them by the teacher. Taking pictures or video using any electronic device is strictly prohibited, unless part of an instructional program under the guidance of a staff member. We encourage families to discuss these expectations, as well as your own, with your child before sending him/her to school with a personal electronic device.
