Principal's Message

We're just over half way through the school year now. This is a great time to do a check in with your child. How does he/she feel the year is going? What are the successes? What are the struggles? What are the proudest moments and best memories so far? Helping your child be reflective of her/his learning is a wonderful exercise that we do frequently with students at school. Having someone else tell you how you are doing (through a report card, teacher feedback, etc) is important to learning, but well-honed self reflection skills are even more critical to life-long learning. Having this conversation with your child will help him/her practice the skills while also giving you insight into your child's perspective on his/her learning. With that, you'll be able to read her/his report card this month with a broader understanding. Report cards for students in Grades 1 to 5 will come home on February 13. Communication of Learning reports for Kindergarten students will come home on February 15.
