A nomination form will come home with your child the first week of school. Please consider if any of these roles would be right for you, and, if so, return the nomination form to the school by September 16. Our first council meeting and election will be held on Tuesday, September 17 at 6:30 p.m. in the Dundana library.

Lunch Lady will again be coming to Dundana this year. This year, our Lunch Lady day will be Tuesdays, second nutrition break, beginning on Tuesday, September 17th. School Agendas

All of our Grade 1 to 5 students will come home the first week with a new agenda, which has been purchased for you by the School Council. We encourage students and families to get in the habit of bringing the agenda to and from school each day. Students will be encouraged to write important school events in it to inform parents. Parents and teachers are also encouraged to use it as a means of on-going communication, as needed. When your child receives his/her agenda, please look at the material in the front few pages. Important school information is featured here, as well as early forms to be filled in and returned to the school in the first few weeks.

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Technology in the School

Our students will, at times, use technology tools – such as iPads – and programs – such as word processing – to support their curricular program, as determined by the classroom teacher. Each classroom has a selection of devices teachers will provide to students as needed and as availability

As well, students will not be permitted to use devices (phones, tablets, etc) for non curricular use during school time, including nutrition breaks. Students who need to contact a parent are advised to consult their teacher and come to the office so those conversations can be supported by school staff. Students do not have permission at any time to take photos, videos or audio recordings of other students, staff or visitors during school time (including nutrition breaks) without the permission of their supervising teacher and the subject of that recording.

Students who use personal or school devices inappropriately will have devices confiscated, parents will be informed, and progressive disciplinary action will be taken.

Students and families are also reminded that students who use social media inappropriately towards other students, or in ways that affect other students, even if this participation occurs outside of the school day, can also be subject to disciplinary action at school and police can be informed if warranted. While children can become very interested in, and adept with, the use of technology for entertainment and social reasons at a very young age, parents are encouraged to closely monitor their use. Social media sites (e.g. Facebook, Instagram) actually do not allow children younger than 13 or 15 (depending on the site) to use their programs. If you have any questions about how technology is used in your child's class, please address that with the classroom teacher. Questions concerning school policy more generally can be addressed to the Principal.

Parents are also encouraged to carefully read, sign and return the Media Consent Agreement (in school agendas) to further your understanding of this important issue.

Arrival and Dismissal Information

In order to keep our students and visitors safe at Dundana, we would ask for your co-operation travelling around the school. If you are dropping off or picking up your child for entry and dismissal, please park in a legal spot on the road across the street from the school or beginning mid-way down the field on the school-side of the street. Our buses need the space in the bus loading zone, across the entry of the small parking lot, and along the side of the road for two bus lengths past the small parking lot entrance. Keep in mind that by-law officers keep our street and school grounds on their route to monitor and will ticket cars illegally parked. Please do not have your child(ren) walk between buses or through the parking lot without adult monitoring and support. Dogs (except service animals) are also not allowed on school property at any time and by-law officers are monitoring this as well.
