Principal Message

This month, progress reports will be sent home with all of our Kindergarten to Grade 5 students (November 19th). Educators will indicate whether students are progressing well, with difficulty, or very well (Grades 1 to 5), and offer some written comments about student successes and next steps (Kindergarten to Grade 5). We know that the last few years have been challenging for student learning in the areas of academics, learning skills, and socialization. Educators have spent the last two months working with students to set routines to help students develop those important learning skills like organization, responsibility, independent work and self regulation. They have also spent a considerable amount of time developing a sense of community within their classes to encourage pro-social behaviour and relationship building among students. Academically, educators have observed and assessed students to find appropriate starting points in learning and teaching. It's been a busy few months, but we are just getting started. The progress report will give you a glimpse at how your child is faring right now against Ministry mandated standards of curriculum. Please take it as one piece of information about your child, but not the only one to consider. There is lots of learning to be done prior to February and June report cards and we know some students may have had a more difficult time than others adapting to learning at school, or had difficulty engaging in remote learning, which may be reflected in their current level of achievement. If you have questions about your child's progress, please connect with your child's teacher for that subject. HWDSB does not have a formal day for interviews this year following progress reports, as has been past practice. Instead, educators will continue to communicate with parents and caregivers throughout the year as needed or requested. As always, thank you for all of the work you do at home with your child to help them be successful here at school. We couldn't do it without you!

HWDSB and Hamilton Public Health recently sent out a system-wide reminder to all families that everyone is asked to wear a mask while on school property including parents/ guardians /caregivers, even if remaining outside for drop off or pick up.

At Dundana, we try to continue time outside whenever possible and encourage all students to come prepared for the weather. At times, our playground can get very icy, which may necessitate an indoor entry in the morning, but we can still find ways to get outside at other parts of the day. When the temperature falls below -15 or the wind chill is below -20, we will be required to shelter indoors.

Winter weather means lots of extra clothing pieces for students and we are still not able to host a lost and found box. Please try to label student items or find ways to keep them together (e.g. mitten clips) to help your child keep track of all of their personal items while at school.

Remembrance Day - November 11

Students will be provided with a poppy on Thursday, November 11 as we engage in learning and reflection for Remembrance Day. Students are welcome to bring in a small monetary donation on that day that will be passed on to the Royal Canadian Legion Poppy Fund. Although we are not able to physically assemble for our Remembrance day activities, classes will participate in our virtual assembly during period 3 (11:15-12:05).
