**A note from our Kindergarten Team** – *A reminder that the kindergarten play pen, equipment and materials are available to kindergarten students during the school day only and we ask that students in Grades 1-8 do not enter the fenced area or use the items that have been purchased or provided for this learning environment at any time. Materials are intentionally introduced by educators for our youngest learners and used in a way that encourages play-based education -- when older students enter the pen after school hours the resources (including the young trees, tools, fabrics, etc.) are being treated in a way that damages the outdoor classroom. We encourage you to use the larger playground as it is designed for students older than 5. Kindergarten parents are also encouraged to use the larger playground after 3:00 as the kindergarten play space is designed to function as an outdoor learning environment. Thank you for your cooperation as we ensure all of our play spaces are used appropriately for the safety of our school and students.*

**Visitors** – for the safety and confidentiality of all students and staff, **all visitors** are required to enter the school at our main doors and check in at the office upon arrival. We look forward to supporting your visit with us.
