b) iPad roll out: This is a Board wide initiative. Consent/Code of conduct forms have gone home and students have received iPads. Lots of discussion on their digital citizenship and apps have been created to enhance existing learning. E-Best will be tracking the success of the iPads via student questionnaires. School has firewall in place to protect students from misuse but parents need to be responsible and monitor use while in the home. C. Pillinini requests that students charge their iPads at home so they are fully prepared for the school day.
