

What Compulsories do you have left?

- 18 compulsory credits
- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in Canadian history
- 1 credit in Canadian geography
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics
- Plus one credit from each of the following groups:
- New 1 additional credit (group 1): additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or a Native language, or a classical or an international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education
- New 1 additional credit (group 2): additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a second language, or cooperative education
- New 1 additional credit (group 3): additional credit in science (Grade 11 or 12), or technological education, or French as a second language, or computer studies, or cooperative education
- + 12 optional credits
- In addition to the credits, students must complete:
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- the provincial literacy requirement

Plan Backwards

Plan grade 12 courses, then plan grade 11

Check college and university requirements for different schools to know what you need.

Check grade 12 pre-requisites: e.g.

- SPH4U needs SPH3U
- CLN4U needs any grade 11 U/M Canadian and World Studies, English or Social Science
- HHS4U vs. HHS4C any grade 11 U/M Canadian and World Studies, English or Social Science vs. the same or "C"
- TMJ4E needs TMJ3E

e.g. Science Degree

Need:

ENG4U, MHF4U, MCV4U, 2 of SBI4U, SCH4U, SPH4U, one other 4U/M course

Grade 11:

ENG3U, MCR3U, SBI3U, SCH3U, SPH3U, 3 other courses

e.g. University - B.A. degree

Need: ENG4U, 5 other 4U/M courses

Grade 11: ENG3U, MCF3M, 4 other courses

e.g. University - Kinesiology or Business Degree

Need: different universities have different admission requirements

Grade 11: cannot plan without knowing what each school requires

DO YOUR RESEARCH NOW:)

e.g. College - Engineering Diploma

- Minimum requirements for admission to the Civil Engineering Technician Diploma
- OSSD including:
 - Grade 12 English, C or U
 - Grade 12 Mathematics, U or MCT4C or MAP4C ≥ 80%
 - Grade 10, 11 or 12 Design Technology recommended

e.g. College – Social Work Diploma

Minimum requirements for admission to the Social Service Worker Diploma program

- OSSD including:
 - Grade 12 English, C or U (minimum 70% guideline)
- Program orientation is strongly encouraged
- Significant volunteer experience is recommended
- For competitive programs (the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of available places), selection will be based on the average of the highest senior level final grades in the required courses that are available at the time of ranking.





What is a SHSM? Specialist High Skills Major

 A specialized pathway to engage students by giving them specialized experiences in their area of interest

 Specific criteria to meet - set by the Ministry of Education

 Students earn a SHSM Red Seal on their diplomas and SHSM Record of Activity

- Arts and Culture Digital Arts
 - Manufacturing CAD/CAM
 - Transportation
 - Business!

- Major credits (4 in total)
- "Other" credits (different for each SHSM)
- Co-operative Education Credits (2 Co-op)

Co-op – Mr. Guther, Mr. Brankovic

Step 2: Select HWSHSM in Career Cruising to show interest and you will be called to a meeting

Step 3: Come to Guidance to create a possible plan for your next years' courses

Co-Op Education

- Work Experience for 2 or 4 credits
- DVSS Co-op Am or PM (2) or all-day (4)
- Special requests (1 period)
- Need your own transportation to your placement (car or city bus)
- e.g. education, daycare, St. Joseph's Villa, salons, stores, etc.
- OYAP is a possibility through Co-op if the employer is willing to sign you on :)
- Talk to a co-op teacher in the Co-op office about potential placements


