LUNCH AREAS

We ask that you please obey the school rules and do not block the egress to school; this means that there can be no eating or sitting in the school hallways (unless it is a designated bench area). Please eat either in the cafeteria or in designated teacher classrooms. There is plenty of room to accommodate our school population to have lunch. SCHOOL COUNCIL

The first meeting of the 2019-20 School Council will be held on Tuesday, September 17 in the Learning Commons at 6:30 p.m. At this initial meeting our School Council election will take place. We would love to have as many parents involved in our School Council as possible so that we create a school community together with our parents as partners in education.

STUDENT VOICE

We honour student voice and want to support all students to have a voice in their education and our school culture. Having a voice means we do this with respect to our individual differences and ensure we work within the processes and policies of HWDSB. We have Student Council which is the vehicle for all students to voice ways to make our school a better place. We ask all students to work within the school processes so that we can help them express their voice as legitimate student voice which is informed within the school code of conduct and reflective of the HWDSB policies and directives. So please work through student council and/or administration.

NO SMOKING ON SCHOOL PROPERTY (this includes e-cigarettes and/or vaporizers)

No smoking in or on school property is a City of Hamilton by-law that all school buildings and properties follow. We ask all students and staff not to smoke on school property as the By-Law Officer will come and the consequences could lead to fines issued and school-based consequences. For your safety too, all smokers are asked to be mindful of their environment and respect all neighbouring properties and school property. DVSS does not allow any e-cigarettes or vaporizers in or on school property. The consequences for smoking in or on school property will be exercised by the administration should students be found with e-cigarettes or vaporizers.

LOCKERS

Lockers will be assigned by your Period 1 teacher. You must bring in a combination lock, share the combination with your teacher and open the lock in front of your teacher. Once you open your combination lock, your Period 1 teacher will assign you a locker. You must only take a locker that is assigned to you. If you take a locker that is assigned to someone else, you will be asked to remove the lock or your lock will be cut off. The goal is to support you in being close to your first period class. If you wish to change your locker, then come see a VP and they will re-assign your locker.

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE

With the support of School Cash Online, you can now make online payments through our school website or using your credit card. This is a win-win by making it safer and more efficient for everyone by reducing the amount of cash and cheques coming into our school. While parents will still have the option to send cash or cheques for school related expenses, we encourage you to register today and begin receiving notifications by email. If your child is moving to another HWDSB school in September, by registering now, your payment history and registration will move with you to the next school. TIMETABLE

Timetables are available for pick up the week of August 26 - 29 from 8:30 am - 1:30 pm. If you need to make a timetable change, please note that all timetable changes will start the week of September 3rd.

Grade 10-12 timetables will be with students' homeroom teachers (if you have not picked it up during the last week of August). Homeroom class lists will be posted the first day of school in the cafeteria. Students can find their names and go to their homeroom to pick up their timetables.

The Guidance Office and counsellors will be available Monday, August 26 - Thursday, August 29 from 8:30 am - 1:30 pm for new registrations. Counsellors may also be available for timetable conflicts and changes if time permits. Students may drop in to see if they can be assisted between registration appointments or wait until the first week of school to make timetable changes. The best thing to do is make all the changes you want to your timetable as soon as possible so that you do not miss any class time.

The program will run from 9 am to 1 pm Tuesday, August 27th to Thursday August 29th. Please bring sunscreen, nut-free snacks, water, comfy clothing and school supplies.

All grade 9 students who have not registered for the above programme are welcome to pick up their timetable & forms from Monday, August 26th to Thursday, August 29th from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm.

STUDENT PARKING

Student parking is limited to the parking lot next to the tennis court and the last row near Bridlewood (in the circle part of the school). Please do not loiter in your vehicle. Bringing your vehicle to school is a privilege; therefore, please respect all the vehicles around you and any pedestrians who may be nearby. Please avoid speeding and driving recklessly...your life and the lives of those around you matter. If you are found being careless in your vehicle or not abiding by school rules, this administration will ask you not to bring your car on

Please respect the adults who work in the school, as this will support the spirit of the school. Respect all signage in the parking lot. By-law officers are invited to come into the school and will ticket any car that does not respect the school rules around parking.

PARENTS/GUARDIANS/VISITORS PARKING

Parents/guardians/visitors please respect the parking lot signage around the school parking lot and entrance. In order to best protect our students, we ask that all drivers wait for their child(ren) either on the parking lot near Bridlewood, or in the parking lot next to the tennis courts. Please do not stop or park in the fire route areas by the front doors or any other prohibited area. By-law officers will be invited to the school property and will tickets drivers who do not follow the Parking Lot signage.
