Other Business / Parent Concern raised: Smoking/vaping - what is school doing about it?

- Gail responded: suspension if caught. It is a collective responsibility of all community, requests
 adults to inform staff if it is witnessed, staff responds immediately. Information provided to
 students regarding legislation, rules at beginning of each year
- Alternatives for Youth Council (Caroline) sent CAMH info to Gail, CAMH hosting a Facebook live

- discussion regarding issue on Nov 28th from 7-8pm
- Vaping also now embedded in curriculum
- Kara also advised that during last PA day discussed vaping/cannabis, reviewed health impacts and shared resources team is now writing information for Phys Ed staff to utilize. Also discussed lack of regulation and challenges to enforce/monitor use in personal spaces i.e. bathrooms
- Off school use receives one warning onsite immediate suspension and confiscation resulting in increased number of suspensions in school
- staff is trying to increase monitoring and increased focus on educating students
- Parent question raised: regarding laws
 Gail advised of available reporting line, police involvement if required and bylaw officer can be engaged but they need to witness act. Referrals to Alternates for Youth for assistance will be made if necessary
