This award is given to a graduating student who has made a significant contribution to the musical life of the school and/or community and shown a commitment to participation in musical performance and/or education.


The BETTE NORTON MUSIC AWARD is sponsored by the LYNDEN SPRING REVUE and was established in 1992 to promote participation in music performance.



#### **Copetown Lions Karl Bruederle Science Award**


Awarded to a student attending post-secondary in a science field


### Dr. Colin M. Day

### Laura Miller Award in Public Speaking


This award is presented in honour of Laura Miller, a Speech Arts teacher with the Hamilton Board of Education, to recognize excellence in public speaking.

Laurie Williams was a dedicated teacher with the Hamilton Wentworth District School Board for 32 years. His career began in 1969 at Dundas District High School, upon closure of the school he moved to Highland Secondary School in 1982. In 1987 he moved to Parkside High School where he taught until his retirement in 2001. He was one of the few teachers who taught at all three secondary schools in Dundas. Throughout his time as a teacher Mr. Williams was a very dedicated football coach. He deeply cared about his students and had a significant positive influence on them well beyond the basics of classroom teaching. Laurie Williams was a gifted teacher, coach, friend to many and a man of unwavering faith, honesty, integrity and strength.

#### Margaret "Pearl" Jones Memorial Award


This award is given to a graduating student who best represents the six pillars of character: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring and Citizenship.


#### **Ontario Principals' Council Award for Student Leadership**

#### Parkside Legacy Award


This award is for a student who is continuing in education at a post-secondary level and who has contributed significantly to the life of the school.

This is awarded to a promising student pursuing STEM studies.




### **Specialist High Skills Major HWDSB Award**

The Weiner Family Mathematics Scholarship is a continuation of that award, re-established at Dundas Valley Secondary School.

To be considered for this award, the students must be enrolled in two or more technological courses and demonstrate the following:


1) high achievement in the Technological Studies Program
