Ontario Secondary School Graduation Requirements for Students Starting Grade 9 at Dundas Valley in 2025

WHAT ARE THE 17 REQUIRED CREDITS?

4 credits in English (1 per grade)
3 credits in math (grade 9, grade 10, and one in 11 or 12)
2 credits in science
1 credit in tech education (grade 9 or 10)
1 credit in Canadian geography (grade 9)
1 credit in Canadian history (grade 10)
1 credit in the arts
1 credit in health and physical education
1 credit in French as a second language
0.5 credit in career studies
0.5 credit in civics and citizenship
1 credit from the STEM-related course group

To graduate, students must earn 30 credits:
17 are required
13 are optional

One credit will be earned from any of the following STEM-related courses:

- Business studies
- Computer studies
- Cooperative education
- Mathematics (beyond the 3 required)
- Science (beyond the 2 required)
- Technological education (beyond the 1 required)

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

- taken in grade 10 when the student is taking English

Grade 10 Financial Literacy Test

- taken in grade 10 math class
- must earn 70%

2 eLearning credits

- parents / caregivers can opt the student out of this requirement (in Parent Portal)

40 Community Involvement Hours

- Can begin in the summer before grade 9

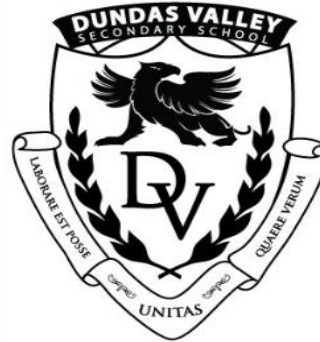

What to understand about the eLearning experience:

- lessons are **not taught synchronously (or live)**, but are posted online for students to read and view
- you will have one period to work on your eLearning course, but you can work on the course in the evening/at lunch
- students can work in the library, in the cafeteria, or at home
- **Learning Skills are very important to be successful in an eLearning course – independence, organization, time management and initiative are key habits**

Additional Program Options

- **FSF1O1** – If you have not had the required 600 hours of French instruction in elementary school
- **ENG1L1, MAT1L1, SNC1L1**
 - Locally developed English, Math and Science
 - For students not yet working on grade 7 or 8 curriculum expectations
 - Recommended by teacher and parent/guardian

Who is the Locally Developed Program for?



Locally Developed courses are for students who ...

- Need explicit literacy and numeracy instruction to meet grade expectations
- Benefit from smaller class sizes and explicit instruction
- Want to pursue the workplace pathway
- **Want to improve their literacy and numeracy skills so they can take 1W courses**
- Want concrete learning
- May want the opportunity to try out increasingly complex tasks with assistance

What destinations are available for students in Locally Developed Courses/Pathways?



- Students' progress from compulsory classes such as English and math into workplace destination courses in senior grades.
- In senior grades, students may apply to an Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program in their area of strength that will give them authentic work experience and training.
- Some colleges offer foundation programs that provide a student with the opportunity to upgrade their skills to enter a diploma program.
