ON APRIL 30TH !!!**

This is a \$1500 bursary and is given yearly **if** a suitable candidate applies and is accepted. The money may also be divided if multiple candidates should apply and be accepted. The bursary has the following stipulations. Skilled Trades will receive priority, but soft Trades and apprenticeships will also be considered.

1. Candidate must apply via this application form by April 30, 2025.
2. **A complete résumé must be included with the application form.**
3. The Rotary Youth Services committee will review all applications and communicate the outcome prior to the 2025 graduation ceremony or conclusion of the school year.
4. **Letters shall be provided by two references outlined in the application.**

Requirements:

1. A candidate **must be enrolling in a full-time post-secondary educational co-op style program.** This could be a Skilled Trade or similar technical program where hands-on work experience is combined with classroom training to achieve a provincial license in a trade recognized by the Ontario College of Trades or a TSSA (The Technical Standards and Safety) recognized discipline.
2. **A candidate must demonstrate outstanding involvement in community and school extra-curricular activities.**
3. **A candidate may indicate financial need** to pursue post-secondary education where applicable.
4. **A candidate must reside in Dundas or attend a local secondary school.**

This award was established in honour of Tom Tittel, former head of Guidance at Downsview Secondary School and former Guidance Consultant for the York Region Catholic District School Board. His caring personality and positive approach in engaging students 'to be the best they could be' became his trademark. He was instrumental in the formation of the Ontario Guidance Leadership Association (OGLA) which has established this honour in his memory for his dedication to youth in our schools today.

This award is open to graduating students who:

- are pursuing post-secondary studies in the social services areas (childcare, teacher, social worker, etc.).
- attend a publicly supported secondary school in Ontario
- have demonstrated a commitment to their academic studies
- have demonstrated outstanding leadership in peer helping in the school.
- have demonstrated leadership in one or more community organizations.

The applicant must prepare a **250-500 word** overview of activities relevant to the social services area and which also demonstrates their suitability for this award.

Deadline: April 28, 2025. The value of the award is \$250.

FULL DISCLOSURE: MAY 2nd

Full Disclosure refers to the date before which you can drop a course and it won't show up on your transcript. This semester, full disclosure is May 2nd. Please make an appointment with your guidance counselor if you're considering dropping a course before that date. If dropping the course will reduce you to two courses only, you need to get permission from the principal to make the change.
