SPECIALIZED PROGRAMMING NOTE:

Recommendations for specialized programming will be made using a team approach involving elementary and secondary school staffs, the student, and family/caregivers/guardians. Specialized programming in Grade 9 includes:

- **Locally Developed courses** in English (ENG1L), Math (MAT1L), Science (SNC1L), and French (FSF14)
- **FSF101** – can be chosen if the student has not had the minimum of 600 hours of elementary Core French instruction.
