Bennetto French Immersion Transition Advisory Committee Summary Notes

• Bennetto will have Grades 1-3 for FI starting in September 2018. The program will grow each year so Grade 4 added in 2019, Grade 5 in 2020 and so on until 2023 when Grade 8 is introduced.

• Mary Hopkins School is currently doing this.

• Any kid that is currently at EK and in FI for Grade 1 or 2, and lives within Bennetto's FI boundary, will have to go to Bennetto for FI. The school board is not offering a choice on this because the school board wants to ensure that Bennetto's FI will be viable.

o Affects 24 grade ones and 19 grade twos. This is considered a healthy class size to start with.

Exceptions are made for the nine Grade 1 and 2 kids that have a sibling at EK that is in Grade 3 or above. Priority is on keeping families together.
 However, while courtesy transportation may be available, it is not guaranteed, and no transportation is provided for the younger sibling to go to EK.
 After grade 5 they transition to Bennetto unless there is an older sibling at Ryerson

· Plans to get the new Bennetto FI kids introduced to the new school are underway and BFI parents are encouraged to get involved to see how that looks

Parents Reaching Out (PRO) Grant 2018

EK Grant Amount: \$1,000

Details of our Proposal:

Tech-Free Engagement Evening

- provide parents with resources that allow them to engage with the school and their children in learning and lifestyle choices in an environment that does not depend upon the ability to access technology
- parents and their children will visit each stations where they will be introduced to resources that will help them promote learning and lifestyle choices without the use of technology

Three ministry goals met by this evening:

- Enhances parent involvement with their children's learning to support student achievement and well-being
- Eliminate barriers that may prevent parents from fully participating in their children's learning
- Enhances communication between school and parents

Creative Club Family Math Night: Does this fit into our PRO Grant funding?

- Mandate of the Creative Club is "families building and learning together"
- Activities in the math evening are completely screen-free
- Structure of the evening involves parents and children moving through five stations where they engage in activities that promote learning and choices that do not depend on technology
 - Stations include the following: building a sports stadium out of lego; superhero station that focuses on patterning; building and testing out ramps; using the giant everblocks; activities that focus on symmetry
- Activities provide ideas and resources to parents and children that promote healthy lifestyle choices without the use of technology
- Cost: \$895 +tax

This workshop fits the overall goals of our funding and what we need to report on (three ministry goals), while providing a math focus. It therefore hits two specific areas that parents are interested in: engaging children in a technology-free way and supporting math learning.
