Nutrition Program / Lunch Lady

- Going to keep some snacks in fridge but the nutrition program is finished for the 2017/18 year. Mainly fruit (apples and clementines).
- \$1200 left in nutrition program, but we will be expected to use that next year
- Need to determine who will cover cost of extra fruit.
- Spent \$7,000 this year. Approximately \$1150 per month.
- New application goes to Tastebuds in June. Funding is dependant on numbers and we will be notified in September as to how much we will get.
- Tastebuds recommends doing fundraising at our school to raise extra money for program.
- Lunch Lady has generated some funding
- Milk is expensive \$0.56 per unit. Should we reintroduce a 5 day milk program? Did generate an extra \$1,000 per year when it was a seperate program.
- Program is asking for teacher feedback on food choices.
- Breakfast on the Beach is a fundraiser from Tastebuds. They are asking if we would consider putting a silent auction basket together. Sign up is April 30.

*After budget discussion with Gay, we decided to spend \$100 on gift basket for Tastebuds, and allocated \$300 to cover fruit to supplement kids' lunches when necessary for the rest of the year

Open House Update

- Scholastic Drops off book fair material Tuesday April 24 and gets picked up May 1; Set-up the morning of the book fair
- Great advice: confirm a debit machine is required in lots of time.
- Spiritwear is going to be sold need a volunteer to run the table. Forms must be sent to school with child so no order forms will be accepted the night of open house; no markups on spiritwear
- There is \$1000 available from "kickbacks" from previous spirit wear sales; we approved teachers' request to use this money for team shirts for athletics program competition. These shirts will belong to the school.

Book Swap

- Kindergarten area worked well last year and is also approved for this year
