Principal's Report

 \rightarrow Open house was great! Lots of people, huge turnout! It was great to have families IN the building.

 \rightarrow EQAO is happening for grades 3-6 and will be online. Kids will have tech provided and it will be spread out over a longer timeframe to allow for that access (May into June).

→A letter will be coming home to families with information about Fire Drills, Lockdown, Hold and Secure, Bomb Threat, and Shelter-In-Place. Richelle will be clear about dates and procedures to give families any information that they may need ahead of time.

 \rightarrow Grade 8 Grad—in-person grad will take place Thursday June 23rd. The ceremony will be at the school (4:30 in the gym). The Grand Olympia will be the venue for the formal (meal and dance; activities).

→Grade 8 trip—traditionally they have gone to Ottawa, but we're not quite ready for an overnight. Richelle is in touch with the superintendent to see about day-tip options. Council will be asked for some support financially to offset cost for students. Students will be acknowledged for academic success on an Honour Roll (80% and above) and Principal's Honour Roll (90% and above). Are lawn placards still an option? Richelle is in touch with the Board to see if they have a contact or provider, and if cost is being covered.

New Business
