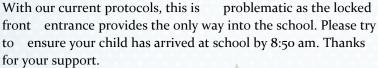


### **Parent -teacher Communication**

## **Winter Recess & Weather**

With the winter weather upon us, this is just a reminder that all students are expected to go outside for recess and students need to bring the necessary clothing to make recess enjoyable (i.e. winter coats, snow pants, hats, mittens and winter boots). Students must go outside for physical activity and health benefits. Also, we do not have supervisors inside during recess breaks. Time outside is important; after students come in from outside, they are able to re-focus faster and concentrate better. Recess allows them time to get some fresh air, unmask and time to run around. In fact, there are numerous scientific studies that have found that being outdoors for 20 minutes or more gives children a mental edge, not just a physical one. If the weather is extremely cold (-25 Celsius or colder), we modify time outside or students are kept indoors.

#### Covid -19 Protocols

At Bagshaw, we take our responsibility for stopping the transmission of Covid-19 very seriously. As Ontario is now in the Red Zone, we ask support from families to continue to:

- 1. Significantly limit visits to the school. Only come to the school when absolutely necessary.
- 2. As everyone gets more comfortable with the new "normal" school routines we are noticing that a number of our students are forgetting to bring/losing their masks on a daily basis. Please encourage your child to make sure they have a mask with them when they leave for school in the morning and when not being worn to keep them in a safe place. Keeping an extra mask in your child's book bag is also helpful for those who misplace their masks or get them dirty.
- 3. Encourage your child to follow all Public Health protocols at school, including always staying 2 meters from others while outside.
- 4. Promptly pick up your sick child when asked by school to do so.
- 5. The expectation is that parents/guardians will please wear a mask when dropping off or picking up a child on Board property.

## **Health & Safety Drills**

Fire Drills and Other Health and Safety Drills: We are required to have different drills throughout the year so that students become aware of emergency procedures. This includes Fire Drills, Shelter In Place, Bomb Threat, Lockdown, and Hold and Secure. We have concluded our fall practices and the next drills will take place in the spring
