2. Student's Report – will be ready for February's meeting, Hilary Millington and Carrie McLean to facilitate

3. Teacher's/Principal's Reports

Leanne Tovey shared:

- a) Accomplishments of the various sports teams at FC
- b) Holiday concert was a great success! Grade 7's organized and ran all aspects very impressively, and teacher collaboration was amazing; thanks to council for the contribution of Cobs Breads for the bake sale; approximately \$800 was raised through ticket sales, donations and bake sale, and will be used for the school's music and arts programs
- c) Grade 6's have started a poster design contest to promote April's Boston Pizza Night; winning design will be sent home to families, and all other designs will be put on display around the school

Mark Hopkins shared his enthusiasm about a great month ahead:

- a) Grade 8 transition activities: January 11 there will be a visit from WDHS to review options/pathways; January 16 is Parent Information Night; January 22 will be transition meetings with the LRT-Lee Davis; January 30 A day in the life at WDHS is planned for students
 - *Emphasis on readying our students for a successful high school career (learning about themselves and encouraging awareness of their own learning style; hoping to improve upon HWDSB's 82% high school graduation rate)
- b) Great news: FC will be having our graduation ceremony at WDHS
- c) Little Jammers (learning guitar) is starting after school on Thursday (January 10) for grades 1-6
- d) FC Cell Phone Practices: an initiative to set everyone up to "win" by sharing reasonable and appropriate expectations regarding the use of cell phones at school.

We Agree To

YES – to appropriate use of cell phones (No photos or videos)
YES – to cell phones during class, following the direction of the Teacher
YES – to appropriate use of cell phones outside during nutrition breaks

YES – to cell phones in lockers and in pockets during inside portion of nutrition breaks (including indoor recess)

*Issue put to council: how to deal with students using their cell phones to contact home

Conversation around effective communication and having all adults in the loop regarding changes in the student's day (ie; illness, change in pick-up plans, etc), safety concerns, idea of not wanting to create dependence on parents throughout the school day, keeping teachers and staff the main source of problem solving as appropriate.

Conclusion: we would hope to keep the office as the main hub of communication with home, requiring students to contact parents from the office and involve teachers in problem solving; importance of sharing the expectations with parents and caregivers

- e) Report Cards will be sent home February 12 (Assessment/Evaluation of selected specific expectations at the half-way point of the year; to reflect learning on a continuum)
- f) Student Learning & Achievement: PA Day activities were math focused, leaning on Application and Thinking as being somewhat more important than memorization and knowledge
 - *always meeting students where they are*
 - -survey being designed for students likely in Grades 4-8 regarding positive school culture and caring adults
