Principal's Report (Mrs. Del Mastro)

September Reorganization

• Biggest re-org in a few years, over 90 students were impacted. Another kindergarten class added. Teachers are preparing for new students to join their new classes on Oct 3. Reason for reorganization is due to rebalancing needed to meet ministry guidelines for class sizes.

Construction

- Hallway ceiling tiles and lighting, music room storage and soundproofing, Junior bathrooms are all complete
- Phase 2 beginning which includes intermediate bathrooms, staff bathroom, caretaking room. Work will take place in the evenings and weekends with a goal of a 2-month completion.
- Q kids turning off the light switches in bathrooms while students were using the restroom was an issue last year, has something been done to prevent this?
- A kids no longer have access to a switch and with the open concept entry it stays quite bright

School Fundraising Plan

 bussing subsidies, grad wear, access athletics, music program)
- Funds for shade and Gaga Ball noted by council.
- Mrs. Del Mastro is required to submit a fundraising plan to the board that maps out the whole year.

- Welcomed many new/returning teachers to Franklin Road
- Leadership team beginning October (supported by Ms. Mair & Ms. Marchand) to plan fall dance (Oct 31, goodie bags sale)
- Grad wear for sale (coming soon)
- Jr. Swim team practices have begun (supported by Mr. MacQueen, Mrs. Skinner and Mrs. Thorpe) practices are held on Thursdays in October and the meet will be November 3
- Sr. girls' volleyball season starts Oct 6. Other volleyball teams in their tryout phases (all supported by Ms. Kelly, Mrs. Skinner, Ms. Ballardo, Ms. Montgomerie Ms. Mcgowan, Mr. Macqueen and Ms. Mair)

Agenda Topics

Shade committee update

- The dermatology grant has been cancelled and is no longer available. The shade committee (Sarah Marsden,
 Rachel Smith, Dale Bullock, Michelle MacIntosh) are always looking for ideas and connections for permanent
 shade solutions for the rear play area at school from anyone in the school community. Finding a
 permanent/semi-permanent shade structure for students to have a place to cool down outdoors in the heat is
 the goal.
- Some brainstorming included possible fencing along the gym side of school as it does have good afternoon shade, looking into shade sails that can be put up and only have to be taken down in high wind/snow/ice, and reaching out to local Rotary Club for assistance as per Evelyn, looking for new grants etc.

School wear fundraiser

 In future could we include smaller items in the school wear fundraisers to have some more affordable options (croc jibbits, stickers, and lanyards)? Staff did look into options but found they would have had to pre-purchase large stocks, not ideal. Rachel has a lead that she can look into that seemed very reasonable for purchasing these items.

Team photos

• There was follow-up if we were able to complete team pictures for students on sports teams/clubs last year. Attendance in June isn't great and so there were a lot of students away as well as some who were not interested.

Possible solution – have the coaches/club leaders take these photos as the teams/clubs are active throughout the year to ensure they capture most. Those who don't want to or don't have photo consent can forego participation. Students must have consent for photos to be shared.

Pizza days

Beginning October 1, dates will be posted in Schoolcash online through the end of December.

Pita days

• We will likely use Ginos for wraps again. They are not customizable. We did not have good feedback from Pita Pit (too much lettuce, not enough other toppings)

Fundraising ideas for this year

- A food fair with a "breaking of bread" feel for families of Franklin Road. A coming together of families sharing meals together via international fare for dinner.
- Living Rock does a very successful soup fest.
- Mini mall. Have heard this has a huge return. Families would donate gently used or new items (books, toys, play doh, doughnuts) and sell in a mini mall type experience.
- Chocolates (bars, covered almonds)
- Cinnabon. Easy. Good return, they don't expire.
- Spring market. Lots of vendors are interested. Possibly use library and gym on a weekday to keep more profit
- Krispy Kreme? Actual donut boxes. Would need to be picked up, sorted, distributed.
 - Q For fundraising, are there ethical and healthy habits to follow in regard to which type of companies we use?
 - A There are guidelines set out for fundraising through the board
- Next meeting we will set out our fundraising plan to submit to the board.

Grade 8 grad

Q – can parents/families contribute ideas to children of theirs graduating this year (trip/dinner/activity ideas)?

A – No, it's not a council topic. It is planned within the school. We save some fundraising for grad, but we can't as a council fundraise specifically for one class or one trip.

Q – Could there then be a council of grade 8's who work to plan ideas for their grad to ensure they'll be happy with their big celebration?

A – No. The students discuss ideas as a group during class time and have an opportunity to vote on their grad celebration activity

A – Teachers decide whether to take the class on a trip or not
